

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

(Catechumenate) is the process of welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is meant for those who are not baptized, baptized into another Christian Church or baptized into the Catholic Church but have yet to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. I DIDN'T KNOW THAT !!??

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church on the meaning and purpose of priesthood:

1591 The whole Church is a priestly people. Through Baptism all the faithful share in the priesthood of Christ. This participation is called the "common priesthood of the faithful." Based on this common priesthood and ordered to its service, there exists another participation in the mission of Christ: the ministry conferred by the sacrament of Holy



Orders, where the task is to serve in the name and in the person of Christ the Head in the midst of the community.

1592 The ministerial priesthood differs in essence from the common priesthood of the faithful because it confers a sacred power for the service of the faithful. The ordained ministers exercise their service for the People of God by teaching (munus docendi), divine worship (munus liturgicum) and pastoral governance (munus regendi).

A Note about becoming a Sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation

It is a great honor to be asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. The role of a "godparent" is to be an "other parent" in matters of our holy Faith. That is why sponsors should be practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older, must have received Confirmation and currently living a good Christian moral life. If a sponsor is married, that person should have participated in a valid Church marriage. A nominated sponsor may be asked to get certification from his/her parish where they currently reside. The certificate explains that the individual is qualified to be a sponsor, a current parishioner of the particular parish where they are living, and be known to the priest as being a faithful, practicing Catholic, attending Mass there weekly. Here at St. Francis of Assisi, Certificates of Sponsorship are given by the pastor to REGISTERED MEMBERS of the parish who are practicing Catholics and who meet the above criteria. Please see the pastor to inquire about getting a certificate.
