

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

(Catechumenate) is the process of welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is meant for those who are not baptized, baptized into another Christian Church or baptized into the Catholic Church but have yet to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. I DIDN'T KNOW THAT !!??

From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* concerning *the Resurrection of Jesus as an Object of Faith*:

648 Christ's Resurrection is an object of

faith in that it is a transcendent intervention of God himself in creation and history. In it the three divine persons act together as one,



and manifest their own proper characteristics. The Father's power "raised up" Christ his Son and by doing so perfectly introduced his Son's humanity, including his body, into the Trinity. Jesus is conclusively revealed as "Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his Resurrection from the dead." [Rom 1:3-4; cf. Acts 2:24] St. Paul insists on the manifestation of God's power [Cf. Rom 6:4; 2 Cor 13:4; Phil 3:10; Eph 1:19-22; Heb 7:16] through the working of the Spirit who gave life to Jesus' dead humanity and called it to the glorious state of Lordship.

649 As for the Son, he effects his own Resurrection by virtue of his divine power. Jesus announces that the Son of man will have to suffer much, die, and then rise. [Cf. Mk 8:31; 9:9-31; 10:34] Elsewhere he affirms explicitly: "I lay down my life, that I may take it again... I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." [Jn 10:17-18] "We believe that Jesus died and rose again." [1 Thes 4:14]

Letter of Sponsorship for Baptism & Confirmation

-Be an active, registered parishioner for at least 6 months. This means, you must attend Mass regularly, you are committed to stewardship of your time, talent and financial resources to our parish and the Archdiocese of NY

-You must have received the sacraments of Baptism & Confirmation

-If married, it must be a recognized marriage by the Catholic Church.

(Note: Letters or certificates should come from the parish where you currently reside.)
