

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

(Catechumenate) is the process of welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is meant for those who are not baptized, baptized into another Christian Church or baptized into the Catholic Church but have yet to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their family life, to worship regularly at Sunday Mass and to participate in ongoing Religious Education. Our programs include ages 6 to 17. Adult Religious Education programs are offered during the year.

I DIDN'T KNOW THAT !!??

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church on the Eucharist as the true Body and Blood of Jesus:

1333 At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood. Faithful to the Lord's command the Church continues to do, in his memory and until his glorious return, what he did on the eve of his Passion: "He took bread ... " "He



took the cup filled with wine ... " The signs of bread and wine become, in a way surpassing understanding, the Body and Blood of Christ; they continue also to signify the goodness of creation. Thus in the Offertory we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine, [Cf. Ps 104:13-15] fruit of the "work of human hands," but above all as "fruit of the earth" and "of the vine" -- gifts of the Creator. The Church sees in the gesture of the king-priest Melchizedek, who "brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering. [Gen 14:18; cf. Roman Missal, EP I (Roman Canon) 95]





CEMETERY SUMMER CLEAN UP

We need your help to keep our cemetery clean and in good order by removing all artificial flowers, plants and decorations. This will prevent damage to the lawn maintenance machines, and help us avoid injury from flying debris expelled from the machines. Please note that flowers in front of the grave stone can only extend 18 inches from

the front of the stone, to allow for free access of all lawn care machinery and cemetery vehicles. No plastic and wire fencing around grave plantings are allowed at this time; no shrubs and no trees may be planted by the grave. Please remove all artificial flowers at this time, as they can damage the lawn care machines. Dogs are NOT allowed in the cemetery. We have received complaints about people walking their dogs in the cemetery.

Please consult the SFA Cemetery rules. A full copy of the CEMETERY RULES may be picked up at the cemetery office at the rectory. Please help us keep our cemetery clean and in order.
