

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

(Catechumenate) is the process of welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is meant for those who are not baptized, baptized into another Christian Church or baptized into the Catholic Church but have yet to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. REMEMBER HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY?

It's More Than Lots of Repetitious Prayers

On Tuesday, September 20th at 7pm in the church there will be a short workshop on how to pray with the Mysteries of the Rosary. During the month of October pray a rosary a day for healing of the division in our country, and for peaceful midterm elections. October is also the month we remember the Blessed Virgin Mary's apparitions to the 3 children of Fatima, Portugal in 1917 when she asked the world to pray for peace.

I DIDN'T KNOW THAT !!??

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church on the new Christian Passover of Jesus:

1340 By celebrating the Last Supper with his apostles in the course of the Passover meal, Jesus gave the Jewish Passover its definitive meaning. Jesus' passing over to his father by his death and Resurrection, the new Passover, is anticipated in the Supper and celebrated in the Eucharist, which fulfils the Jewish Passover and anticipates the final Passover of the Church in the glory of the kingdom.

1341 The command of Jesus to repeat his actions and words "until he comes" does not only ask us to remember Jesus and what he did. It is directed at the liturgical celebration, by the apostles and their successors, of the memorial of Christ, of his life, of his death, of his Resurrection, and of his intercession in the presence of the Father.
