

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

(Catechumenate) is the process of welcoming new members into the Roman Catholic Church. It is meant for those who are not baptized, baptized into another Christian Church or baptized into the Catholic Church but have yet to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. 

I DIDN'T KNOW THAT!!??

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church on the Mass [Eucharistic Sacrifice] as a Sacramental and Unbloody Sacrifice Commanded by Jesus:

1356 If from the beginning Christians have celebrated the Eucharist and in a form whose substance has not changed despite the great diversity of times and liturgies, it is because we know ourselves to be bound by the command the Lord gave on the eve of his Passion: "Do this in remembrance of me." [1 Cor 11:24-25]



1357 We carry out this command of the Lord by celebrating the memorial of his sacrifice. In so doing, we offer to the Father what he has himself given us: the gifts of his creation, bread and wine which, by the power of the Holy Spirit and by the words of Christ, have become the body and blood of Christ. Christ is thus really and mysteriously made present. 1358 We must therefore consider the Eucharist as:

- -- thanksgiving and praise to the Father;
- -- the sacrificial memorial of Christ and his Body;
- -- the presence of Christ by the power of his word and of his Spirit
