PASTOR'S MESSAGE & FAITHFULLY DEPARTED



The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is a fundamental doctrine of Faith in Christianity, one that is understood not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. We believe in this Mystery because Jesus, who is God, taught it, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it, and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith.


In the New Testament, there are several references to the doctrine of the Trinity. First, the Annunciation (Luke 1:26-38) describes how God the Father sent the angel Gabriel to Mary to announce to her that God the Holy Spirit would "overshadow" her, and that God the Son would be In the New Testament, there are several references to the doctrine of the Trinity: 1. The Annunciation (Luke 1:26-38) describes how God the Father sent the angel Gabriel to Mary to announce to he that God the Holy Spirit would "overshadow" her, and that God the Son would be made flesh in her womb. 2. During the baptism of Jesus (Matthew 3:16-17), the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus in the form of a Dove, while people present heard the voice of God the Father from the clouds. 3. John (chapters 15-18) presents Jesus' detailed teaching on the Persons of the Holy Trinity. 4. In the preaching mission, the risen Lord gives to His disciples, He commanded them to baptize people "in the Name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit." (Confer also Matthew 28:19; John 10:30).

What are the life messages you and I should embrace on our journey of Faith in correlation with today's Feast? We need to respect ourselves and respect others. Our conviction of the presence of the Triune God within us should help us to esteem ourselves as God's holy dwelling place, to behave well in His divine presence, and to lead our lives practicing acts of justice and charity. The Triune Presence should also encourage us to respect and honor others as "Temples of the Holy Spirit."

We need to recognize God as the Source of our strength and courage. The awareness and conviction of God's presence within us give us the strength to face the manifold problems of life with Christian courage. It was such a conviction that prompted the early Christian martyrs, when taken to their execution, to shout the heroic prayer of Faith from the Psalms: "The Lord of might is with us, our God is within us, and the God of Jacob is our helper" (Psalm 46).

Lastly, our calling is to become more like the Triune God through all our relationships. We are made in God's image and likeness. Just as God is God only in a Trinitarian relationship, so that we can be fully human only as one member of a relationship of three partners. The self has to be in a horizontal relationship with all other people and a vertical relationship with God. In that way, our life becomes Trinitarian like that of God. Unfortunately, our society follows the so-called "I-and-I" principle of unbridled individualism and the resulting consumerism. But the doctrine of the Blessed Trinity challenges us to adopt an "I-and-God-and-neigbor" principle: "I am a Christian insofar as I live

in a relationship of love with God and other people."


