FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Dream of Gerontius

In my column last week, I explained the Church's teaching that the condition of our soul at the moment of death is what determines our salvation. And for those souls who are in a state of grace, the reward of Heaven is given either immediately or after a purification (cf. Catechism, 1022). This process of being purified before entering Heaven is what the Church's theology refers to as Purgatory. "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (Catechism, 1030). Our belief in Purgatory is rooted in the revealed truth that we need to be purified before joining the perfect holiness of life with God. As we read in the Psalms, "Who may go up the mountain of the Lord? Who can stand in his holy place? The clean of hand and pure of heart, who has not given his soul to useless things ..." (Ps 24:3-4).

The truth of Purgatory reminds us of the real effects of sin. Even absolved sins can leave a mark or residue on our souls, often in the form of attachment or inclination to sin, and these effects need to be purged from the soul before it is ready to join the divine life of the Blessed Trinity. As one theologian explains, "Part of the process of purgatory is the gradual purification of all misguided loves, all particular hates and misgivings and all resentments, envies, rivalries, jealousies, and hardheartedness or lack of mercy toward other persons" (Fr. Thomas Joseph White, O.P., The Light of Christ, 276).

The reality of Purgatory is described beautifully by St. John Henry Cardinal Newman, a convert to Catholicism in the 19th century. In a lengthy poem called "The Dream of Gerontius," Newman imagines the experience of a soul after it dies. First, the soul senses it is free of its body, as it hears the echo of the Last Rites that were spoken by the priest. The soul then meets his guardian angel who has been watching over him since his birth and who ushers him to the "House of Judgment," where he is told he will see God for split second. On the way, the soul passes choirs of angels who sing of the redemption that Christ accomplished for the human race. The soul then arrives at the "Sacred Stairs of the Presence Chamber," as he hears again the echoes of the prayers for mercy uttered by the priest at his deathbed. When the soul finally sees the face of Christ, he is struck both by the intensity of Christ's holiness and by remorse for his own sinfulness, and he realizes that he is not yet ready to enjoy the Beatific Vision of God. At this, he begs his guardian angel to bring him to a place where he can be purified and remade in the image of God. This need for purification is why we pray for the deceased, to assist them as they are prepared to enter the everlasting joys of Heaven.


