FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Our Father: Part II

Continuing our reflection on the prayer of the Our Father, we can consider the meaning of the seven petitions which Catholic tradition says are included in the version of the prayer recorded in St. Matthew's Gospel, which the Church has employed in her liturgy (cf. Mt 6:9 -15). According to St. Thomas Aquinas, "The Lord's Prayer is the most perfect of prayers. ... In it we ask, not only for all the things we can rightly desire, but also in the sequence that they should be desired. This prayer not only teaches us to ask for things, but also in what order we should desire them" (*Catechism*, 2763).

After calling God "Our Father," and reminding ourselves that He dwells in Heaven, we make our first petition to Him, that His name be kept holy: "hallowed by thy name." "The desire that God's name should be something hallowed, something kept apart and rescued from all unworthy associations – that is not so much a favor we would ask of him as an act of benevolence towards him on our part. It is a protestation from us, that the God to whom we pray is a God of such infinite holiness, that the very name by which he is known among men should be a word not spoken lightly, but full of mystery and awe" (Fr. Ronald Knox, Pastoral and Occasional Sermons, 27).

But when we pray that God's name will be kept holy, we should remember that this requires of us, not only certain speech, but also certain behavior. "[W]e ask that this name of God should be hallowed in us through our actions. For God's name is blessed when we live well, but is blasphemed when we live wickedly. ... We ask then that, just as the name of God is holy, so we may obtain his holiness in our souls" (*Catechism*, 2814). Praying for the holiness of God's name requires holiness in us who call on that name.

Asking first that God's name be revered is also a matter of courtesy and politeness, before we request other favors for ourselves. As Fr. Knox reminds us: "We are to call him our Father, with childlike confidence in his love for us; but having so addressed him, we are not to plunge straight into the business of petition, as if nothing could possibly be of more importance than the needs which we feel at the moment, as if nothing could possibly interest him except our petty concerns, our importunate anxieties. The citizens of that heaven in which he dwells cry 'Holy, holy, holy' before him day and night; shall not we do well to tune our voices to that chorus of praise, before we dare to ask him for anything? Hallowed be his name; a hush must fall upon our hearts, a pause must be made in our tumultuous thoughts, before the right atmosphere can be established in which we, creatures of a day, can approach him who dwells in inaccessible light, the sovereign Ruler of Creation" (Knox, 29).
