

Words from our pastor, Father Bernie Carman, S.A.C.,

+ ALL IN ONE +

This year the Christmas events seem to all flow into each other. With Christmas on a Saturday, the following celebrations of the Holy Family, Solemnity of Mary – Mother of God, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord almost all roll into one long festival.

The danger is that the unique quality of each event might be missed as time rushes on. Each celebration is full of messages, wisdom, information. This should not be overlooked.

At the same time, all these events are interrelated. The key to all of them is the Incarnation and God's desire to save us all in a human, almost natural way. The Lord Jesus becomes one like us to open our way to heaven. A wonderous, spiritual exchange happens in real, human circumstances.

The Nativity is the fulfillment of millennia of promise. It brings the "end time," even if the Apocalypse takes centuries or millennia to occur.

The Holy Family is the human means of Jesus' entering into human history with the miraculous conception in Mary and the collaboration of Joseph, His foster father.

The Solemnity of Mary confirms her unique role in the history of salvation.

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus' saving presence to all nations, all peoples.

With all the craziness, the shopping, the traveling, the decorating, the feasting - set aside a good amount of time to reflect on each event and the full meaning of God's entire saving plan. †


