Words from our pastor, Father Bernie Carman, S.A.C.

† WASH ME AND I WILL BE CLEAN †

With the Baptism of Jesus it is time for a brief review of the first of the Seven Sacraments.

A Sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace. Each one has its particular sign and its special grace. With Jesus' own Baptism this Sacrament is established. He receives it though of all people He had no need of it. But as in other things Jesus never asks of us what He would not / did not do Himself. As is said in the liturgy, He is Baptized in water made holy by the One Who was Baptized.

By Jesus' time many ceremonial washings were known. They usually represented purification or preparation. These and other meanings were condensed into the meaning of Baptism.

We are born in a weakened condition, prone to temptation and sin. We are not evil, but the failure of Adam and Eve, and consequent sinning by people, creates a situation in which the image of God - in which we are created - is muted, distorted. Baptism brings us back. This condition is called original sin. Baptism is the remedy.

We are social beings, made in the image of the Holy Trinity. Baptism brings us into the family of the Church, the community of believers, that exists to aid us in following the Lord and living a Godly life. We are not expected to "go it alone." Jesus also established the Church.

Water is the outward sign. It means cleansing, purification, destruction of sin, influx of new life.

We can reflect on our Baptism. Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation we can renew its effects. The other Sacraments enhance and expand our life in the Lord. **†**
