## FEAST OF ST. VINCENT PALLOTTI 9:30a.m. Mass - January 23

St. Vincent Pallotti Council
K of C to offer refreshments in
Church Hall after Mass

St. Vincent Pallotti was born in Rome in 1795, became a priest, and dedicated himself completely to God. He dreamed of gaining for Christ all non-Catholics. He inaugurated a revolutionary program which envisaged the collaboration of the laity in the apostolate of the clergy. But Saint Vincent was also well aware of the many deprivations that hindered the spread of the faith. He obtained and spent huge sums for the poor and underprivileged and founded guilds for workers, agricultural schools, loan associations, orphanages, and homes for girls - all of which made him the pioneer and precursor of Catholic action. His great legacy was the congregation which he founded for urban mission work - the Society for Catholic Action. This indefatigable laborer for Christ died in 1850 from a severe cold, most likely caught on a cold rainy night after giving his cloak to a beggar. He was the uncle of Cardinal Luigi Pallotti and is buried in the San Salvatore Church in Rome.

## ARCHDIOCESE OF BALTIMORE'S COVID-19 TASKFORCE PROTOCOL

(excerpted)

- All parishes in jurisdictions where masking is required (such as Baltimore City) are required to follow those mandates.
- All liturgical ministers and clergy are to wear masks, except when speaking.
- Parishes are asked to carefully evaluate all ministries and activities during January to determine how to transition them to a virtual or limited contact mode.
- For in-person ministry activity, masking is required for ALL parishes and ALL participants as well as other safety protocols, such as hand sanitization, social distancing (minimum 3-feet) and contact-tracing of positive cases among the attendees.
- Individual third party users of facilities for January events such as wedding receptions, family reunions, etc. *already* scheduled, may proceed; however, parishes should not accept new requests for January.
- During Mass, parishes are to carefully evaluate the logistics of choir activity. If the choir can safely perform with spacing and other considerations, it can continue. However, if a parish is concerned, use of a single cantor is suggested.
- All parishes must carefully adhere to proper hand sanitization following the distribution of Communion on the tongue.


