

that the audibility has been challenging. We'll do our best to address this. Thanks for tuning in.

It's been wonderful to see the return of so many parishioners, as Covid has begun to recede locally and substantially. The huge size of our church brings reassurance that we have plenty of room and have not had to be cramped. I know that each person or household has to make their best decision as to when they can return to the regular practice of Sunday Mass. Aside from Covid considerations, however, let's all never forget—and let's spread the word—that steady, weekly attendance and active participation at Mass is an essential resource for Catholic living. Without that cornerstone of our lives, we are without the Eucharist as our spiritual nourishment and we are liable to lose our balance spiritually.

Please take note of the meeting, to be repeated five times between June 12 and June 16, that will offer everyone in our Holy Name community a chance to listen, consider and speak about our mission as we face the future. *Coming Out of Covid* will be a stronger project if you can take part. See the full-page description in this bulletin. Note the chance to have pastoral visits to parishioners' homes, a welcome feature that was not possible for a long while.

This Monday we will welcome seminarians David Joanis and Alex Charow, who will be with us for 8 weeks this summer. For them it is a period of observing, assisting and reflecting on the life of the parish as they discern the call to priesthood. For all of us it is an opportunity to do our part to pray for and with them and for some parishioners to open their hearts and homes to them. Both are studying for the Archdiocese of Boston and are students at St. John's Seminary in Brighton. I am so glad that they are coming.

**Pentecost** For 50 days we have been celebrating Easter and the Resurrection of Jesus and our salvation. Saturday May 22 and Sunday May 23 we will celebrate Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit to guide and strengthen us. Besides coming to church and joyfully worshipping with us, make sure to wear something **RED**. Just as the apostles were joined together as the first church community by the Holy Spirit, let's join our parish community together by wearing the color of the Holy Spirit.



**Jesus Gave Us the Invitation.**

The reading today and this reflection is from the scripture readings for Ascension Thursday. The Ascension, when Jesus rose body and soul from earth to heaven, is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Below are comments from *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* about the Ascension:

Deacon Tim Donohue

665: *Christ’s ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus’ humanity into God’s heavenly domain, whence he will come again;*

666: *Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father’s glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever.*

The scripture I chose for this reflection is the first reading from Saint Paul’s letter to his faith community in Ephesus. Ephesus was an ancient port city in Turkey. The city was once considered the most important Greek city and the most important trading center in the Mediterranean region.

Saint Paul is writing this letter from prison. He was imprisoned several times because he was brave enough to preach about Jesus Christ in places that did not want to hear this message, in places where people wanted to believe in other gods. Saint Paul did not stop teaching, but he did spend time in jail. Saint Paul was a great writer and in this portion of his letter he is asking us to live up to the example he is setting—to live to be worthy of what we are called to be.

What is that? We each have a special place in the world. What is our calling? We have to listen and follow our hopes and dreams to find our place/ our calling. Who is calling us? God is always attentive to us - ready with grace and hope whenever we ask. Did we get an invitation? Everyone has an invitation. God loves each one of us the same and some of us are closer to God because we make more room in our hearts for God’s presence. Who will we meet when we get there? Jesus ascended into heaven, and He will be there to meet us when we arrive.

The reading goes on to explain our faith: “...one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.”

We believe in one God. The Greeks and the Romans

believed in many different gods. They had statues and shrines and made sacrifices to different gods at different times. St. Paul is making the distinction that although the more popular belief in many of the places where Saint Paul traveled is to believe in many gods. As Christians we believe in one God—Only one God.

And in the same breath, Saint Paul tells us: “*But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ’s gift.*”

Saint Paul assures us that only some are apostles while others are pastors and teachers. We know some are students, firefighters, police officers, store keepers, teachers, doctors, nurses, lawyers, judges, elected officials and farmers. When we grow up there are so many different things we can do with the graces that God has given us.

Another way to think about this is we are all Children of God, and we are all made by God in His image and likeness. But we are all different. We are all made with \$100 dollars’ worth of parts, and the parts are all different. And we can develop, teach and nurture these parts the way we want to. So we are all valuable and all make our contribution, but we do it differently at different times in different places.

We all have different roles to play in life. The grace to do that comes from God, the one God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Along with the grace that God gave us to be whom we will be we received an invitation from Jesus, who invites us to join Him in Heaven at the end of our journey.

- Pray in a shared way for concerns or people important to you.


