begun its work. Tom and I are conferring on how we, as a staff and then as a parish, will honor and thank him for his talents shared so freely and kindly over the past quarter-century. Stay tuned for the result of that. While Tom's leaving his work had to end abruptly for reason of disability, his residence in West Roxbury will stay in place until he moves to his family home in Michigan in the fall. So, he is still sharing this New England summer with us.

This upcoming week, we are coming near the end of our time of hosting David Joanis and Alex Charow, our seminarians. They have been a delightful addition to the rectory. They have helped a lot at liturgies and have helped with our outreach to parishioners in many ways. Please pray for them as they, like all seminarians, discern God's will for their futures.

I am grateful to our whole staff, parish and school, to all of you for the deep commitments to Holy Name that I continue to admire. Never hesitate to be in touch with me or any of us on our staff, if there are any ways

with the intention of going to medical school. I had always dreamed of being a doctor.

What I didn't know when I moved to Boston, however, was that God had other plans for me. During my freshman year, I had a very profound conversion experience. I was raised Catholic, but never really took my faith seriously. It was during a retreat held by the campus ministry that I had truly encountered Jesus Christ for the first time and had experienced His presence in the Eucharist. This radically changed my life, as from that point forward, I wanted to learn more about my faith and who Jesus is. Over the course of my time in college, I had grown in my faith, and during that growth, heard God calling me to be His priest. Hearing that call and learning what God had created me for gave me so much peace and joy that I couldn't do anything else. After I graduated from BU in 2014, I immediately entered the seminary.

After two years of seminary at St. John's, Brighton, the Cardinal sent me to Rome for the remainder of my formation and to do advanced theology studies. I was ordained August 1, 2020, and for my first year as a priest, I was back in Rome to finish my advanced theology degree. I now hold a Licentiate in Sacred Theology (STL) in the area of Moral Theology, with a specific focus in Bioethics (also holding a certification from the National Catholic Bioethics Center). Having finished my studies, the Cardinal assigned me to Holy Name. I am very excited to be here and to be your priest. I hope to offer my gifts in service to the Lord and to you. As your spiritual father, I will certainly serve you in any way I can, pray for you, do my part in leading you closer to Christ and helping you to be the saints God has called you to be. Please let me know any way that I can be of service to you. And please bear with me as I learn the ropes at a new parish. Father Denis Nakkeeran

Hi everyone, my name is Father Denis Nakkeeran. You can call me Father Denis. I am the new parochial vicar at Holy Name. I had the pleasure of meeting many of you this past weekend, but of course there are many more to meet. For those who did not get a chance to hear me speak

this past weekend, I will offer a brief synopsis of my background. My ethnic

origin is Sri Lanka. I was actually born there, but my parents and I moved to the US before I was two years old, so America is all I know. I grew up in Brooklyn, New York and moved to Boston for college. I went to Boston University, majoring in Human Physiology

COVID Vaccine Advisory There have been a few questions regarding the COVID vaccines and their moral implications. Here is a brief summary of the key points of the issue.

1) It is a known fact that all of the approved COVID vaccines have used fetal cell lines at some point in the manufacturing or testing phases of vaccine production. These cell lines are derived from fetuses that have been aborted (at least 2 of prominence). The J&J/Janssen vaccine used fetal cell lines in manufacturing and testing the vaccine, while the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines used fetal cell lines only in the testing.

2) Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical letter *Evangelium Vitae* in 1995 states, “The use of human embryos or fetuses as an object of experimentation constitutes a crime against their dignity as human beings who have a right to the same respect owed to a child once born, just as to every person” (n. 63). Experimentation done on cell lines derived from these aborted fetuses would also constitute unjust experimentation, which is against human dignity.

3) The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF), in a note titled “Note on the morality of using some anti-Covid-19 vaccines,” published on December 21, 2020, in line with previously published Vatican documents, states that for grave reasons, vaccines that are produced with fetal cell lines can be taken if there is a grave enough reason. The COVID-19 pandemic is noted to be sufficiently grave to warrant taking a vaccine, either for one’s own health or the health of others.

4) There are different agents involved in the life cycle of a vaccine (e.g., the manufacturers, those distributing cell lines, and the recipient of the vaccine). The moral culpability of each party is different.

5) We, as Catholics, are called to witness to the truth of the dignity of all human persons from conception to natural death. The specific form this witness takes can vary and be discerned in particular and practical matters.

What You as a Potential Recipient of the Vaccine Should Know:

1) As per the CDF document of December 21, 2020, you may take any of the clinically approved COVID vaccines in good conscience due to the gravity of the pandemic. You are not obligated to receive a vaccine if you do not want to.

2) None of the current vaccines are completely morally sound. Therefore, none of these vaccines can receive a positive and unqualified endorsement, even for all the potential benefit, since the ends never justify the means. But, it is clear that some vaccines are less morally tainted than others (Moderna and Pfizer are better because they are less linked to the use of fetal cell lines than J&J/Janssen). You are not obligated to prefer one vaccine over another, though it would make sense to prefer the less tainted vaccines. Still, there are legitimate reasons to prefer the more morally tainted vaccine, such as potential allergic reactions to substances used in one versus another.

3) Instead of endorsing any of the current vaccines, one can receive any of the vaccines, and even manifest their preference, while still witnessing to the sanctity of life and the dignity of the human person by speaking out and voicing the desire to find ethical sources to manufacture the vaccine. In speaking the truth in charity, we can call all of our brothers and sisters to Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life, who teaches us the truth of the human person.

4) You are also not obligated to refuse the vaccine due to its moral status, though you are free to do so.

Our Commission Jesus summoned his apostles and sent them out on their mission, their ministry. It must have been a very exciting time for them. They have been training for this, and now they are on their own, with the powers Jesus gave them to do what He had been doing—casting

out demons and healing the sick. Jesus is showing confidence in his Apostles. All they have been doing is watching and being with their teacher. Now Jesus is giving them an opportunity to do His work. Think about the work they are called to do. The work is very important—not go do this for me, pick up dinner or see if you can find a new pair of sandals. This is life and death miracle work. That must have been awesome for the Apostles.

I remember my commissioning when I graduated from college. When you become an officer in the armed forces you are commissioned. You are asked to follow orders and to follow the rules. You raise your right hand and take this oath: I will...carefully and diligently discharge the duties of the office to which appointed by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging...and I will observe and follow such orders and directives, from time to time, as may be given by me, or the future President of the United States of America, or other Superior Officers acting in accordance with the laws of the United States of America. That is the US Armed Services.

Today, Jesus summoned his apostles to begin the work of bringing the Kingdom of God to the world. In Jesus' world the *orders and directives* are values and ideals and rules that we accept that we understand as right and wrong. These *orders and directives* come from Jesus' teaching and his gospels. The Navy had rules that were written down. Our country has laws that are carefully written with a whole legal system in place to enforce the laws.

The Apostles were asked to accept their commission and to follow the unwritten laws from the Gospel and the Church's teachings that we come to understand in our hearts. I think we have the harder task to discern, to find the truth and the right and wrong, ourselves in our own hearts.

But before they went out, before they left, the Apostles

first had to accept this commission. They had to agree that this is what they believe and want to do. Even though Jesus is the most powerful person in the universe—power and authority beyond our understanding—He cannot make any of us do anything we don't want to do. Jesus gave us our free will and the chance to say YES or NO to following Him, to accept our own commission to follow Him. Or as in this gospel today, the opportunity to accept His summons.

When we accept the summons, when we accept our commission, to follow Jesus and we undertake His call to do His work, we don't get a uniform and collar insignias to tell people who we are or what rank. Rather, like the apostles. We wear our everyday ordinary clothes and go about meeting people and talking with people and delivering the gospel message in our ordinary way, aware of the gospel values, attitudes, respect and love that Jesus showed to us.
