***I Was Thinking*** “Labor Day is a time to pay tribute to American workers, and all of their many contributions and achievements through the years. Created by the labor movement in the late 19th century, Labor Day honors the men and women who fought tirelessly for workers' rights, especially the eight-hour workday we have now.” I’m not sure exactly where I got this definition of Labor Day, but having spent two weeks away with my family, I know for certain that there is no such thing as an *eight-hour* workday. I’m not sure if it was the invention of computers, iPhones or the Covid epidemic that caused work to bleed into all areas and hours of life; but for so many, their work is totally intertwined into their daily lives. But this article isn’t about work or a pessimistic outlook. (even though I can easily have one). We had a great vacation. And now we’re back. And for kids, Labor Day means something else.


Excitement is in the air. The kids are getting ready! Parents are ready! The emails naming teachers are coming in. And the required items: folders (3-section), markers (water soluble), masks (3-ply) pencils (#2), crayons (Crayola), notebooks (spiral bound), water bottles (Yeti), lunch boxes (soft) and schoolbags (no wheels) clutter families’ living rooms as the kids organize and re-organize their supplies. What is subtly clouding the excitement of school starting is the feeling of anxiety: are we facing a resurgence of Covid, presently called the epidemic of the unvaccinated. Our children are now the most vulnerable but that does not seem to affect the selfishness of those who refuse to be vaccinated and have the best interest of others at their core. The challenge for me, as it may be for others, is how, as adults, we support the children’s excitement yet stay focused and calm in the face of our own anxiety.

The Chinese have a symbol that means both crisis and opportunity. Most crises bring opportunities that might not have been evident in other situations. Last year many parents reprioritized their family values as they had rearranged work schedules to home school their children. This year continues to be a time to focus on the future, perhaps borrowing from the stash of the unbridled hope and joy of children. My folks used to say “what doesn’t kill you will make you stronger.” I responded: “maybe.” But we humans do have a great capacity for adapting in times of suffering and crisis. That flexibility and feeling of hope allows us to focus on our strengths and abilities, stay connected to our values and to one another. Gratitude is a good first step toward opening the door to flexibility. The more we practice gratitude, the better our brains get at reorganizing a more positive outlook. Think of a person for whom you are grateful; focus on the feelings that arise; hold them in your heart; hold those feelings. Mini-meditations like that can get us through even the most stressful times.

Optimism is the tendency to see and judge things in their most favorable outcome. Resilience is our ability to overcome difficult circumstances and grow in the face of adversity. These two virtues are key in our ability to move forward when we feel most anxious. My cardiac rehab team emphasized that being optimistic can help make our thoughts and emotions more positive which in turn gives our immune systems a boost. I cautiously concede that the threat of the coronavirus does not have to become so traumatic and overwhelming that it interferes in our day-to-day living again. Taking proper precautions, of course.

In my daughter’s book, *Home Made*, Liz wrote “*Grief is the ultimate marinade; you become more of what you were already: the lonely, lonelier; the angry, angrier; the restless, more restless. Somehow the faithful manage to emerge more faithful.*” The entire Covid pandemic, the reality or the threat, is about grief. Scientific studies have shown, but we, who are faithful know, that persons with faith who are involved in tragic circumstances often report finding peace, hope and even increased faith in the midst of the experience. Consequently, they tend to report high satisfaction in their lives. “*We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed...Struck down, but not destroyed*” 2 Corinthians 4:9. We can all benefit from this kind of faith, optimism and determination. And the amazing side effect is that the children will feel it from us and thrive.

It's Labor Day weekend. Excitement is in the air. Sharpen those pencils; label the lunchboxes; buy healthy snacks, it’s time for school! Say a prayer with your children. And believe “...*he called out to them, ‘Do not be afraid, I am here’...*” John 6:20




