First Sunday of Lent

March 6, 2022

"Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert and was tempted."

Luke 4:1-13

Dear Parishioners:

In today's gospel Jesus grapples with the most basic state of humanity: temptation. Jesus, being fully human, experiences temptation just like the rest of us. "When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time." This scene is grand in scope, but it gets at the heart of Jesus' story. Do you want food? Do you want power? Do you want safety? Jesus is fasting, so he's already hungry. He's the single most powerful human to ever walk the earth, and yet his life is that of an ethnic minority in an occupied region. Even though Jesus is God, he's still bound by the political and social systems of his own time, even as he's working to upend them. So, to be met with these temptations of physical satisfaction and immediate power isn't something we should dismiss lightly. Does Jesus send the devil away? Of course. But does the devil get the chance to make his case? Yes. It should hearten us to know that Jesus, like all of us, went through the whole experience of temptation.

Jesus is alone, hungry, poised at the edge of decision making before his Father and his own truth. With perfect timing, the tempter arrives with three attractive propositions.

If Jesus would turn stones into bread, it would bring great personal and social advantages: neither he nor the poor of the land need to be hungry anymore, the tempter implies. But Jesus answers that it is not bread alone, but the word of God that is life-giving food. People of every generation must transplant the wilderness temptations into their own life and times, and the first contemporary temptation is to neglect the word of God and allow ourselves to be seduced by so many other words: texts, emails, mass media, the flood of digital information, our often mindless and heartless inner and outer conversations. The word of God feeds our deepest hungers. Our obedience to this Word is expressed in our attentive listening to its proclamation, especially in the Sunday liturgy, in our prayerful reading of Holy Scriptures, and our efforts to make this Word "living and effective" from day to day.

Today, the parish family of St. Ephrem prays for our

catechumens, Sarah and Andy, as they are preparing for the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. We send them today to the Rite of Election, to meet Bishop Brennan, our shepherd, who will call them to the Easter Sacraments. Let us continue to pray for Sarah and Andy, as they journey to become one with us through the Easter Sacraments, that they will bring to completion the good work God has begun in them.

I want to thank everyone who participated in the events this week as our Deanery welcomed and prayed with the Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis. It was wonderful to be inspired, both young and old, by this young man's life, devotion, and commitment to his Catholic faith. Blessed Carlo Acutis, prayer for us!

Finally, Mr. Thomas Marchesiello has shared with me that he will be retiring in late spring after 45 years of music ministry at St. Ephrem. Not many parishes can say they have had the dedication and talent of the same Director of Music for that long. We are very grateful to Tom for all he has done to enhance and raise our liturgies and beyond. In the weeks ahead we will begin the process of the search for a new Director of Music. More about the process will be explained as we move forward. I ask your prayers for all involved in this endeavor – both candidates and search committee.




