Luke 9: 28b-36

Dear Parishioners:

gospel from Luke describes Today's Jesus' transfiguration as happening "while he was praying," emphasizing the power of prayer to mediate the presence of God and the consequent transformation of the one who prays. Jesus is joined by two of his ancestors, Moses and Elijah. The first of these Moses, had to cope with his people who frequently grumbled about their exodus out of Egyptian slavery and into freedom. After spending forty days on Mount Sinai where God had called him to receive the divine teaching, Moses was transformed by his encounter and his face had become so radiant that when he come down from the mountain to his people, he needed to veil himself lest his brightness blind them. Elijah had encountered God in the silence outside the cave on Mount Horeb/Sinai after his forty-day flight from Jezebel, his too vicious slaughter of the false prophets she favored, and his arrogant ignoring of the other hundred true and hidden prophets of God.

This was probably an awesome and terrifying scene for Peter, John, and James. "Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him." They wake up and their friend Jesus is talking with long-dead heroes, in a cloud of glory. It's almost as if they stumbled into a private meeting of the divine. Peter's reaction is rash but not illogical; he suggests building tents (what we would call altars) to honor the three superheroes standing in front of him. What else could he do? We get another encounter with Peter's humanity when Luke tells us, "But he did not know what he was saying."

Have you ever been this excited? We call lifechanging experience "mountaintop" experiences because of this gospel passage. Whether it's a retreat or a vacation, it's the mountaintop experiences that give us the inspiration and courage to carry on with regular life.

This week we celebrate St. Patrick and St. Joseph. I hope you can join us as we celebrate these great Saints

and our heritage. After each Mass, there will light refreshments for you to take home and continue celebrating. In addition, the Bay Ridge St. Patrick's Day Parade will take place on Sunday, March 27th at 12 noon beginning at Marine Avenue and 3rd Avenue. The parish of St. Ephrem and St. Ephrem Catholic Academy will be marching, I hope you can join us or cheer us along the route.

No funds from the Annual Catholic Appeal are ever used for legal fees or settlements.

All funds received over our assigned goal will be returned to our parish.

Ordinarily, we average 175-180 donors each year. We have 835 parish families receiving envelopes. Imagine if each family contributed something to the Annual Catholic Appeal. Will you be counted in that number?


