FROM TH PASTOR

Fifth Sunday of Lent

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

John 8:1-11

Dear Parishioners:

In today's gospel, we hear that Jesus went off to pray alone, then returned and was swarmed by those who wanted to hear him speak. "So he was left alone with the women before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you? She replied, 'No one, sir." In the midst of this bout of celebrity, the Pharisees, already uncomfortable with what Jesus is doing in the Jewish community, try to use theatrical punishment to turn the mood. They're trying to catch him in a lie and make him resort to violence. He does neither of these things. Instead, he ignores them, and when annoyed, he flips their judgement back on them. It's not an extremely deft moment of rhetoric, but a way to completely diffuse the tension. And what's the result? A sinner repents. The women who committed adultery and was being manipulated by social shame in order to make a point, who could have been violently harmed, walks away a better person.

Sometimes, especially as we read and pray the Scriptures reflectively, we can allow our imagination to lead us deeper into the heart of Jesus, into his human memory and experience. Reflecting on this gospel, might we wonder if, on that temple morning, he remembered his own mother: the fear (holy yet human) she must have experienced, the gossip she probably endured about her pregnancy. And did Jesus also remember the gentle and just man named Joseph who would not cast a stone?

Far away form the temple, in our own experience, are we tempted to use the sins of others to mask our own selfrighteousness, our personal failures and limitations? What attitude do we show to those who believe they have the right to arbitrarily dispense death by war, capital punishment, euthanasia, abortion, or subtle defamation? Are we brave enough to oppose their ethic, in personal encounter or by the ballot box? Do we pray that they will read their own hearts and change them? And are some of us still most condemnatory about those who sin against the two commandments that seem to be written larger than the other eight in our Christian troubles because they are concerned with things sexual? What we need to heap up in our own hears and in our church is compassion that heals, not stones that hurt.

Today at the 12:00 Noon Mass we are celebrating the

third Scrutiny with Sarah and Andy. We hear of the death of Lazarus and Jesus' returning to Bethany to Mary and Martha. Jesus goes to the tomb of Lazarus and calls for him to, "*Come forth!*" Lazarus, bound in burial bands exits the tomb. Jesus then commands others to "*Unbind him!*" We pray not only for Sarah and Andy but for ourselves to recognize what are the things in our life that bind us; that keep us from truly following in Jesus' footsteps—in his love.

Thank you to all who participated in the Bay Ridge St. Patrick Day Parade. It was so great to see so many friends along the way and to celebrate Irish heritage!
