Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also more commonly known as Corpus Christi. This feast day is also the official launch day of the Archdiocese's "Year of the Eucharist. The theme for the coming year is "Encounter Christ's Presence." The Archbishop's goal is to invite us all "to a deeper reflection on our own personal relationship with Christ through all of the ways the Church teaches that Christ is present to us: in the Mass, in the Word proclaimed, in the Congregation, in the Minister (Priest); and of course, in the Eucharist species itself." Many Catholic have lost sight of the Church's historical understanding of the Eucharist. Many no longer believe that the bread and wine offered at Mass truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, just as Jesus said in the Gospels (take and eat, this is my body – take and drink, this is my blood). If you have struggled with this understanding the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, may this Year of the Eucharist be a time for spiritual reflection and hopefully a return to a hunger and longing for the Body and Blood of the Eucharistic Christ.

During this Year of the Eucharist, we will be offering a way for families to pray for vocations through our Traveling Mass Kit. The Mass Kit has a mini chalice and paten that the priests can use when going to celebrate Masses outside of the Church. When you take the kit home for the week, you are asked to place the Chalice and Paten in a place of prominence in your home and pray for vocations, along with a deeper love of the Church for the Eucharist. Information can be found in the bulletin or contact the parish office.

Our Church repainting project has begun. We are hopeful it will be completed in time for next weekend's Mass. This weekend we will be in the Gathering Place for Saturday Mass, and then outside in front of the Church for Sunday Masses (weather permitting.) Please bring a lawn chair on Sunday if you wish to have a seat for Mass. If the weather does not cooperate, then Masses will be in the Gathering Place. Remember - put a lawn chair in your car before coming to Mass on Sunday, June 6th!

Father's Day Spiritual Bouquet cards are now available. There is a donation envelope if you would like to have your father remembered at Masses on Father's Day here at OLC. There is also a Father's day card you can give to your dad, if you are still blessed to have your father with you. The donation envelopes can be placed in the collection basket.

Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The Church as Communion is our loving fellowship and union with Jesus and other baptized Christians in the Church, the Body of Christ, which has its source and summit in the celebration of the Eucharist by which we are joined in divine love to the communion of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (CCC)

Today's feast of Corpus Christi is like a continuation of Christmas, another celebration of the Incarnation of Divine Love, the unending eagerness of the divine to enter into our world, our lives, our hearts.

In the Eucharistic sacrament which we celebrate today, the simplest human food transforms, and transforms those who eat it, into the Body of the Christ. The Eucharist gives us the gift it signifies, the risen Jesus alive again in our midst. Toward the end of his physical lifetime, Jesus sat at table with his companions, yearning for a way to continue his presence with them. In the words we know well, repeated at every Eucharistic celebration, he broke bread ... took the cup ... and said. ...

As he spoke, we can imagine that Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and then looked slowly around at each one present. Perhaps he gestured around the circle as he held the broken bread, as if to say, "You, my friends with whom I break this bread, you who are bound together as a community of disciples, you are my body." And when he took up the cup of wine, perhaps he looked slowly around once more, as if to say, "You in this circle, you are my life's blood, who will be poured out for the life of the world." Jesus finished, saying, "do this in memory of me. Re-member me: come together around tables such as this and make me present again."

Jesus sent his followers to do as he had done: to heal and teach and forgive, to feed the hungry, and to wash one another's feet. He empowered them, telling them that they would do deeds more wonderful than he himself had done. Today's feast of Corpus Christi makes it clear, however, that Jesus didn't send his followers as mere emissaries, witnesses or deputies with specific tasks. He sent them, he sends us as sacramental extensions of himself: I am the vine and you are the branches. Jesus' followers down through the ages, even including all of us, are baptized into his death and life so that we can be his body and blood, sources of grace in our world.

These days are difficult and challenging. Yet we faithfully come together, to remember Jesus, to offer ourselves again to be the sacrament of Jesus' presence in our day, in this particular day; to be his Body and Blood for one another and for a hungry world. Eleanor Craig, SL

Respect Life Ministry: Helping Our Brothers and Sisters in Nigeria

For the entire month of June our poor box collections will be helping 28 families living in a kindred in Abo village in Nigeria where Sr. Francisca is from. OLC collected and sent food to these same 28 families last summer. Our gift of food actually arrived in the village in December- a true Christmas gift! The families that received the food were very thankful to their new American friends at Our Lady of the Chesapeake.

This time all the money collected from the poor box will be given to Sr. Francisca to send back home to her people for food. Sr. Francisca has said that "Their greatest need is food. They are hungry!" The people depend on what they get from a farming system that does not compare to what we are blessed with here in America. The government in Nigeria does not care about the poor like we do here in the United States. In America the poor, the homeless, the sick and the unemployed have "Safety Nets" - the State and Federal government, Food Banks and church pantries that give assistance, but in Abo village that does not exist. The country's political problems and the pandemic have made life more difficult for these families, and the poverty level is on the increase. Sister Francisca and some others from Abo village try to educate the young and feed these 28 families but most of them have many children. OLC's generosity is highly appreciated, and mostly our prayers.

Next week we will learn about the educational system in Nigeria, especially in Abo village.

Our faith formation group for high schoolers meets every Wednesday from 6:30-8:00pm. Come join us!


June 9th Field Day with Cookout
