THE BURIAL OF URNS



All Souls Day, November 2, 2021

The Office of Cemetery Management of the Archdiocese of Baltimore is providing a final resting place for those who were cremated but not yet buried. Families will have the opportunity to bury the deceased in sacred ground at Holy Cross Cemetery (Ritchie Highway) for a reduced cost of \$350. The urns will be in one vault which is sealed and buried. The grave is marked with the date of burial and the deceased's name will be recorded in the cemetery's records so that family and future generations may visit. Those wishing to participate in the November 2nd burial, must register by October 15, 2021.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Please join me in welcoming Karen Froehly to OLC this weekend to assist us with our music. Karen recently retired from Our Lady of the Fields so we are very thankful that she is able to help us while we continue our search for our new Music Ministry director. Welcome Karen!

As I announced last weekend, Fr. Carl Cummings, the pastor at St. Jane Frances in Riviera Beach, has announced that Archbishop Lori has accepted his retirement request, effective July 1, 2022. As per the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning process, the plan is for Our Lady of the Chesapeake and St. Jane Frances to enter into a Pastorate relationship. This means both parishes will be placed under one pastoral leadership. The plan is for me to be appointed Pastor at St. Jane Frances while remaining as Pastor at Our Lady of the Chesapeake. There will also be a yet to be determined associate pastor assign to the pastorate at that time, and the deacons of both parishes, Rick Clemens and Howard Klohr, will be appointed to serve at both locations. Contrary to what you may have read on Facebook, I and the associate pastor will be splitting our time equally between both parishes. Additionally, I will continue to reside here in Lake Shore at OLC while the new associate will reside in Riviera Beach at St. Jane. All of this is outlined in the document *Be Missionary Disciples*, and further expanded upon in Archbishop Lori's Pastoral Letter, *A Light Brightly Visible 2.0*, which can be found on the Archdiocesan website: archbalt.org. (I will put links onto our website as well.) The plan does NOT call for the closing of a parish when two or more are joined together into a Pastorate, but that instead the members of both communities, under a single unified leadership (parishioners, staff, religious and clergy) work together to fulfill the call of Jesus to go and make disciples.

Over the coming months and years, as we move forward in this process of launching our Pastorate, our communities at OLC and St. Jane Frances will have more and more opportunities to come together, to come to know one another and renew old bonds and friendships, and to collaborate in the work of evangelization in the local communities we both serve in the greater Pasadena area. Please keep OLC and St. Jane Frances in your prayers as we take our first steps together down this road.

We have signed a contract to replace one of the HVAC units in the Gathering Place that covers the religious education classrooms. The cost is about \$18,000. If you feel motivated to make a donation toward this replacement, please place in a separate enveloped marked "HVAC". Thank you in advance for your contributions to this project.

Our Poor Box donations for September are designated for the Baltimore Station, a non-profit organization based in Baltimore that works with homeless vets. Poor Box donations in October will go our local pregnancy centers. Thank you for your generosity.

ENCYCLICAL LETTER *LAUDATO SI'* OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME (Cont.)

Saint Francis of Assisi

10. I do not want to write this Encyclical without turning to that attractive and compelling figure, whose name I took as my guide and inspiration when I was elected Bishop of Rome. I believe that Saint

Francis is the example par excellence of care for the vulnerable and of an integral ecology lived out joyfully and authentically. He is the patron saint of all who study and work in the area of ecology, and he is also much loved by non-Christians. He was particularly concerned for God's creation and for the poor and outcast. He loved, and was deeply loved for his joy, his generous self-giving, his openheartedness. He was a mystic and a pilgrim who lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself. He shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace.

11. Francis helps us to see that an integral ecology calls for openness to categories which transcend the language of mathematics and biology, and take us to the heart of what it is to be human. Just as happens when we fall in love with someone, whenever he would gaze at the sun, the moon or the smallest of animals, he burst into song, drawing all other creatures into his praise. He communed with all creation, even preaching to the flowers, inviting them "to praise the Lord, just as if they were endowed with reason".[19] His response to the world around him was so much more than intellectual appreciation or economic calculus, for to him each and every creature was a sister united to him by bonds of affection. That is why he felt called to care for all that exists. His disciple Saint Bonaventure tells us that, "from a reflection on the primary source of all things, filled with even more abundant piety, he would call creatures, no matter how small, by the name of 'brother' or 'sister'".[20] Such a conviction cannot be written off as naive romanticism, for it affects the choices which determine our behaviour. If we approach nature and the environment without this openness to awe and wonder, if we no longer speak the language of fraternity and beauty in our relationship with the world, our attitude will be that of masters, consumers, ruthless exploiters, unable to set limits on their immediate needs. By contrast, if we feel intimately united with all that exists, then sobriety and care will well up spontaneously. The poverty and austerity of Saint Francis were no mere veneer of asceticism, but something much more radical: a refusal to turn reality into an object simply to be used and controlled.

12. What is more, Saint Francis, faithful to Scripture, invites us to see nature as a magnificent book in which God speaks to us and grants us a glimpse of his infinite beauty and goodness. "Through the greatness and the beauty of creatures one comes to know by analogy their maker" (Wis 13:5); indeed, "his eternal power and divinity have been made known through his works since the creation of the world" (Rom 1:20). For this reason, Francis asked that part of the friary garden always be left untouched, so that wild flowers and herbs could grow there, and those who saw them could raise their minds to God, the Creator of such beauty.[21] Rather than a problem to be solved, the world is a joyful mystery to be contemplated with gladness and praise.

Another Name for the Eucharist

The Lord's Supper, because of its connection with the supper which the Lord took with his disciples on the eve of his Passion and because it anticipates the wedding feast of the Lamb in the heavenly Jerusalem.

Breaking of Bread, because Jesus used this rite, part of a Jewish meal, when as master of the table he blessed and distributed the bread, above all at the Last Supper. It is by this action that his disciples will recognize him after his Resurrection, and it is this expression that the first Christians will use to designate their Eucharistic assemblies; by doing so they signified that all who eat the one broken bread, Christ, enter into communion with him and form but one body in him.(CCC 1349)




