- **HOW** we might better serve the mission of the Paulist Center.



JOIN US FOR THE FILM *SOUFRA*

In collaboration with the **International Catholic Migration Commission**, the film *Soufra* will be hosted by the Paulist Center's **Immigration Advocacy Group** on **Saturday September 28th at 6:30 pm, in the Library.**

Soufra's executive producer is **Susan Sarandon** and the film follows the unlikely and wildly inspirational story of intrepid social entrepreneur Mariam Shaar - a generational Palestinian refugee who has spent her entire life in the Burj El Barajneh refugee camp, just south of Beirut. Against all odds, Mariam sets out to change her fate by launching a successful catering company, *Soufra*, and then expanding it into a food truck business with a diverse team of fellow refugee women from the camp; having a profound impact on all their lives. *Soufra* plays to rave reviews, but the film is not shown commercially. it seeks to establish
the reign of God upon the earth.*

great happening illimitably earth)*

*how should tasting touching hearing seeing
breathing any-lifted from the no
of all nothing-human merely being
doubt unimaginable You?*

*(now the ears of my ears awake and
now the eyes of my eyes are opened)*

How would you rate yourself on these R's —
refuse, reduce, reuse/repair, replace/rebuy, recycle?

- **Refuse**, make the choice not to generate waste in the first place
- **Reduce**, make decisions that decrease the amount of waste produced
- **Reuse/repair**, expand the shelf-lives of products; join the growing movement to RE-USE
- **Replace**, next time consider the recycled and green option
- **Recycle**, reclaim the raw materials

(Note that recycling is *LAST* on the list; it is critically important but isn't as effective as preventing waste in the first place.)
