

Abstinence, from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.

Fasting, is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all those between the ages of 18 and 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal, with two smaller meals permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted.

Easter Duty, all those who have received their First Eucharist are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled (unless for a good reason) between the First Sunday of Lent (March 6th) and Trinity Sunday (June 12th)
