

“Andrew first found his brother Simon, and said to him,
‘we have found the Messiah!’ John 1:41

“Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, ‘What are you looking for?’” (John 1:38)?

We can only wonder what it must have been like for the two disciples of John the Baptist to see Jesus turn and look at them, and how glad they were to hear Jesus say after they asked where He was staying, **“Come, and see.”** They would never forget it; for it was the moment of their vocation: Jesus calling them to be *His* disciples.



In 1979, Pope John Paul II reflected on his own call to the priesthood in his annual *Holy Thursday Letter to Priests*. The Pope wrote: *“If there had not been this look, if there had not been this love, I should not be here. I should not be on this way. This way must be my vocation. . . . This is the key principle of the whole of formation to the priesthood and to priestly life, of priestly asceticism and of priestly ministry.”*

That same “look” would happen again when, many years later, Cardinal Wojtyla met in conclave with 110 of his brother cardinals to elect a new pope after the sudden death of Pope John Paul I. On the third day and eighth ballot, at approximately 7:00 p.m., Cardinal Wojtyla was approached by Cardinal Jean Villot who asked, *“Do you accept?”* Cardinal Wojtyla responded, *“In obedience of faith before Christ my Lord, abandoning myself to the Mother of Christ and the Church, and conscious of the great difficulties, I accept.”*

The call to the priesthood—of parish priest or pope—occurs deep within the heart of a man; and after his ordination the realization that God has called *him* constantly affirms and sustains him in the deepest recesses of his spiritual life. As the *Program of Priestly Formation* states, quoting Pope John Paul II’s *Pastores Dabo Vobis* (“I Will Give You Shepherds”), *“For every priest his spiritual formation is the core which unifies and gives life to his being a priest and his acting as a priest”* (PDV, 45, PPF: 106). And again, *“The basic principle of spiritual formation . . .*

is to live in intimate and unceasing union with God the Father through His Son, Jesus Christ, in the Holy Spirit.”

From the very beginning of a man’s vocation, this is what gives him life—that the Lord “looked” on him and chose him. And in turn, the man knows that his solemn responsibility is to “look” upon the Lord in love and with the necessary self-renunciation to leave all and follow Him. In this way, the constant “looking upon” the Lord will be key to his growth in holiness.

Recently I was asked by an applicant for the Archdiocese, *“What is that parishioners most want from their priests?”* It was an easy question. Above all people want holy priests! In this very troubled world of ours today, with basic human values and rights threatened or under actual assault, they want seminarians and priests who give evidence of holiness of life in the world. What people want of their priests is similar to what the Church wants for couples preparing for marriage. For among a couple’s sacred responsibilities is their witness that the holiness of the Sacrament of Matrimony—by God’s design—can be lived fully and faithfully in the world today. For those called to the Sacrament of Holy Orders, St. Maximilian Kolbe says it best: holiness is the most important requirement for the priest.

Admittedly, it can be hard for a man who is considering the seminary to articulate his sense of being called. Just like the disciples in the Gospel, the priesthood is not something you “join” but an invitation you *receive* from God and to which a man responds. Indeed, the sheer joy of being chosen to be a co-worker in the Lord’s vineyard is what propels a man forward to accept the Lord’s will in his life. With ordination the newly ordained priest accepts the call to go “on mission” for the Lord to bring all people to faith and holiness of life. He labors for the reconciliation of the world to God, which is the reconciliation the Father intended for the entire world from the moment we first sinned in the Garden of Eden. This salvific work Jesus accomplished in His Passion, Death and Resurrection, and to which every priest is joined, especially in his celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

God continues to call men to the priesthood. We pray that *they pray* and, with their whole lives, generously give themselves over to God’s will for them.

Let it be reflected in the character and manifested in the life. Christ is sitting for His portrait in every disciple.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19

“Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, “Here I am.” Samuel ran to Eli and said, “Here I am. You called me.” “I did not call you,” Eli said. “Go back to sleep.” So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. “Here I am,” he said. “You called me.” But Eli answered, “I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep.” At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, “Here I am. You called me.” Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, “Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.” When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, “Samuel, Samuel!” Samuel answered, “Speak, for your servant is listening.” Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect. “

Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body.

Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.”

Gospel: Jn 1:35-42

“John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, “Behold, the Lamb of God.” The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” — which translated means Teacher —, “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come, and you will see.”

So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, “We have found the Messiah” — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas” — which is translated Peter.”

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen


