

# FROM THE PASTOR

The grapevine has always been a rich source of symbolism for Israel: “**You transplanted a vine from Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it**” (Psalm 80:8). The prophets readily used this imagery, including Isaiah who spoke of Israel as God’s vineyard: “Now you dwellers in Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. What more could I have done for my vineyard than I have done for it” (Isa. 5:3-4)? No wonder that when King Solomon built the first Jerusalem temple, he decorated the doors of the Holy of Holies with a huge grapevine beautifully crafted in gold. As one ancient historian recorded it, “*the entire façade was covered with gold, and the gate opening . . . had, moreover, above it those golden vines, from which depended grape clusters as tall as a man; and it had golden doors . . . The exterior of the building wanted nothing that could astound either mind or eye.*”



All who looked upon the Holy of Holies saw this magnificent golden sculpture of leaves, grapes, and vines. Wealthy benefactors of the temple’s construction could have their names inscribed on one of the leaves as a memorial. Such imagery even found expression over the entrance doors of individual homes, such as the one below discovered in Capernaum.



Jesus naturally employed this same imagery when He began His public ministry. The key difference, of course, was that Jesus referred to *Himself* as the vine, which led the authorities to accuse Him of blasphemy. But Jesus wanted to make clear to the leadership of Israel—the Chief priests, Scribes, Pharisees and Sadducees—that they had failed in their mission to bear fruit for the Kingdom. And although their efforts to win converts to Judaism enjoyed some success, these same converts quickly became *unfruitful*, mired as they were in the legalism and ritualism that the Pharisees demanded and that Jesus condemned. So Jesus refers to Himself as the “**true vine;**” and that all who believe in Him—the branches—must bear fruit for the kingdom. In fact, believers can do *nothing* unless they are attached to Him: “**I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing**” (John 15:5-6).

Perhaps what is so often missed is this expectation that the disciples of Jesus “**bear fruit.**” Only in this way will you “**prove to be my disciples**” (John 15:8). And what does bearing fruit look like? Jesus says, “**This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you**” (John 15:12). When we keep the commandment to love God and one another, we ourselves are branches of the One God Who is love, branches “heavy” with fruit that will be a harvest for the Lord for all eternity.



## 5th Sunday of Easter

### First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

"When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus. The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers."

And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him,

and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us."

### Gospel: Jn 15:1-8

He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

### Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



### 2021 Archbishop's Annual Appeal Reaching Out, Healing Together




