From the Desk of Father Jason

Dear Friends,

It's that time of year. Our parish finance council, staff and I have worked diligently to provide the cathedral parishioners with a transparent fiscal and spiritual report once again.

This report reveals the dedication and strengths of our inner-city parish that has continued to persevere through another challenging year. I am grateful to the many people who have contributed financially but most especially their lives to the parish.

As the rector and pastor I am trying my best to live out my priestly vocation to preach the Gospel, minister the sacraments, bring people to Christ and make my own weekly offering. A big part of the work of pastoring any parish is the management of funds, buildings, property and a cemetery. As most of you know, in this case we are talking about gigantic buildings that are over one hundred years old, and a cemetery that was founded in 1848. Keeping them going and keeping them in decent shape takes quite a bit of resources. Thankfully we have a finance committee that has members who have business and finance backgrounds. They are very helpful in directing and making wise financial decisions.

This weekend's report is about informing, educating, enlightening and encouraging our parishioners. Happily, I would say that in our parish there is a real attitude and practice of stewardship that has taken hold, there's a relatively seamless and widely shared commitment of time, talent, and treasure. There is room to grow, of course, like in all things, with faith, hope and charity.

During these past 5 years I have learned a lot about parish life from parishioners. Here is what I have learned with regards to giving:

"Give consciently" Write your parish into your family budget. Whether it's on a yearly, monthly, or weekly basis, make your parish offering a line item. Planning ahead will keep you from digging in your pockets to put something in the offering box when you walk into church.

Using weekly offering envelopes or participating in our online giving program, that our parish offers, are two good ways to make your giving conscious.

"Give off the top" When determining how much to give our parish, some people look to what's left over after other obligations have been met. We give out of scarcity and fear, rather than gratitude. Try (at least for a few weeks or months) putting your relationship with God and his people first. Whatever we have we owe to God's generosity.

"Give more than you think you can" People sometimes ask about whether there's a biblical standard. The tithe, or one-tenth of one's wealth or income, is often mentioned in the Bible, and many Christians today aim for a 10% level of annual giving divided among church and charities. (Parish giving, though tax-deductible, is not charity for Catholics. It's a precept; a joyful obligation). Jesus told his rich follower to sell all that he had and give it to the poor – 100%! He praised the poor widow who gave her last two coins to the Temple. In your prayerful consideration, strike a balance between 1% and 100% — pledge to give what you really can and maybe a little more, and to give it gladly and regularly. Don't compare yourself to others; your giving is a covenant between you and your family and God, and God is never outdone in generosity.

"Give yourself" Consider ways to be more involved in the life of your parish this year. See your gifts at work in the various ministries. Explore new ways to use your time and talents in the service of others, not as a substitute for financial support, but as a way of living what that support symbolizes.

"What's next?" As we make this spiritual and financial report this weekend, I also am excited to share with you our plans to undertake the next phase of our cathedral restoration project! It'll be a significant and beautifying next step.






This weekend our finance council presents the annual report of our parish finances. We aim to be good stewards of the resources that you have entrusted to us and hope that you find this information useful.

We are blessed to be able to report not only a surplus of income over expenses, but also a growth in our parish and our parish life. The parishioners of the Cathedral are generous with their time, their talents and their treasures!

It is worth noting that a significant portion (about 90%!) of this “excess” income comes from contributions to the Cathedral Renovation Fund and from Bequests. As the name implies, contributions to the Renovation Fund are restricted for that purpose and may not be used for the operational expenses of the parish.



We have mentioned in earlier years, and it bears repeating now, that without the generosity of the bishop, we would be operating in the red. The salary of our pastor is paid by the Diocese and we are supplied with assistant priests whose salary is paid by their primary assignments. On top of that, the bishop generously contributes to the music and liturgical ministry of the parish!

Because of all of this, we were able to afford our new boilers, *Fire* and *Brimstone*, and because of this we have been able to tuck away some funds each year towards our renovation project.

We are not entirely there yet, but we are certainly well on our way to being able to complete our renovations from the funds we have saved—and without a capital campaign! In the upcoming months, we look forward to being able to share more news about this upcoming project.







Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful)

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this prayer, the celebrant acts in the person of Christ as head of his body, the Church. He gathers not only the bread and the wine, but the substance of our lives and joins them to Christ's perfect sacrifice, offering them to the Father.

The introductory dialogue, establishes that this prayer is the prayer of the baptized and ordained, is offered in the presence of God, and has thanksgiving as its central focus. Following this dialogue, the celebrant begins the Preface.

The Eucharistic Prayers make clear that these prayers are offered, not to Christ, but to the Father. It is worship offered to the Father by Christ as it was at the moment of his passion, death and resurrection, but now it is offered through the priest acting in the person of Christ, and it is offered as well by all of the baptized, who are part of Christ's Body, the Church. This is the action of Christ's Body, the Church at Mass.

The priest offers the Eucharistic Prayer in the first person plural, for example, "Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you..." This "we" signifies that all the baptized present at the Eucharistic celebration make the sacrificial offering in union with Christ, and pray the Eucharistic Prayer in union with him. And what is most important, we do not offer Christ alone; we are called to offer ourselves, our lives, our individual efforts to grow more like Christ and our efforts as a community of believers to spread God's Word and to serve God's people, to the Father in union with Christ through the hands of the priest. Most wonderful of all, although our offering is in itself imperfect, joined with the offering of Christ it becomes perfect praise and thanksgiving to the Father.
