### From the Desk of Father Jason

Dear Friends,

This weekend, the Catholic Church will once again celebrate "Sunday of the Word of God," an initiative established by Pope Francis as a day "devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God." (Apostolic Letter, Aperuit Illis).

### Why focus on Sacred Scriptures?

Because, in the words of the Holy Father, "A profound bond links Sacred Scripture and the faith of believers. Since faith comes from hearing, and what is heard is based on the word of Christ (Rom 10:17), believers are bound to listen attentively to the word of the Lord, both in the celebration of the liturgy and in their personal prayer and reflection."

Pope Francis adds, "devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the Word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world."

### Here are some ways to mark this day:

- 1. Create a *Bible Enthronement* in your home.
- 2. Go through your gift lists for this year, and consider giving the Bible as part of your Christmas, birthday or wedding gifts.
- 3. Make sure your grandparents or the elderly in your family have a large-print Bible or an audio Bible.
- 4. Resolve to read one chapter of the New Testament each day; write down what the Holy Spirit says to your heart. This will become your spiritual diary and a treasure for years to come.
- 5. Create a weekly Zoom or Google Meet group to read, meditate, and discuss the Sunday Gospel with family and friends.
- 6. Take an online free Catholic Scripture course as a way to study God's Word more systematically.
- 7. Take advantage of some of the resources on FORMED.org to explore God's Word in more depth.
- 8. Look up artworks that depict passages of Scripture and discuss them with your children.
- 9. Find a bible podcast that you can listen to and make it part of your daily routine—*Bible in a Year* with Fr. Mike Schmitz is a popular podcast right now.

Make a vow to make Christ the center of your life and to know, live, and transmit God's Word in everything you think, say and do.

Pope Francis invites us never to take God's Word for granted, "but instead to let ourselves be nourished by it, in order to acknowledge and live fully our relationship with Him and with our brothers and sisters."



### **Feast of the Holy Spouses**

Today marks an old feast that is being revived by religious orders, bishops and lay people around the world.

Little is known about the married life of St. Joseph and the Virgin Mary. Only a few episodes are recorded in the Gospels, and each of those focuses on their son, Jesus. Yet, they are held up by the Church as the prime example of a holy marriage, and remain heavenly patrons for all married

couples. Interestingly, for many centuries there existed a particular feast in the Church's calendar that celebrated the marriage of Joseph and Mary. It was called the Espousals of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. It was a feast that fell into disuse over the years and was eventually eliminated in 1961 with the formulation of the new liturgical calendar. However, the Oblates of St.



Joseph made a request to continue celebrating the feast and in 1989 the feast of The Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph, was reintroduced into the proper calendar of the Oblates of St. Joseph to recognize the holy marriage of Joseph and Mary and to uphold married life as a path to holiness.



The Saint Jerome Book Club is meant to encourage each other in this task. We will read one book each month from catholic authors, doctors and fathers of the church, the lives of the saints (or saints in the making), encyclicals of the popes and other writings that will help our spiritual growth. The book club is open to everyone, with the books chosen generally appropriate for those 16 and over. We will meet once a month in Bishop Bradley Hall on the last Wednesday to discuss the book we have read that month.

### A Few "Notes" from Eric Bermani

Whenever we think of the Mass or worship, we must be ever mindful that liturgy is not something we invent but, rather, is a gift given to us by Christ. We are members of the Roman Catholic Church and, as such, our worship has particular characteristics (dare I say "expectations"?) associated with it whenever we gather together for this particular act. One of the central hallmarks of worship is the sacred music we create and participate in. The Church has much to say about this and she safeguards this treasure which is the "source and summit" of who we are as Roman Catholics. This liturgical catechesis, or guidance, must be regarded by us as official church teaching uttered various and mere opinion bv not individuals. "Music is of the highest importance, in the celebration of the divine mysteries, and in the Latin Church among musical instruments, the organ has always held a place of honor. Whether as an accompaniment for singing or as a solo instrument, this instrument adds splendor to sacred celebrations, offers praise to God, fosters a sense of prayer in the faithful, and raises their spirits to God." (Book of Blessings, #1325)

Why music in the liturgy? To some, music at Mass is merely frosting on the cake - nice if you have it, but not really

necessary. However, the Church teaches that sacred music is "integral" to, or "of the highest importance" in the Liturgy. Although there have always been provisions for the "bare bones" celebrations of Mass under modest circumstances, even then, the preferred celebration would include at least some simple chanted parts of the Mass, if possible.

The goal is not to make our worship more complex, but to make it more authentic: "Liturgical worship is given a more noble form when it is celebrated in song, with the ministers of each degree fulfilling their ministry and the people participating in it. Indeed, through this form, prayer is expressed in a more attractive way, the mystery of the liturgy, with its hierarchical and community nature, is more openly shown, the unity of hearts is more profoundly achieved by the union of voices, minds are more easily raised to heavenly things by the beauty of the sacred rites, and the whole celebration

the beauty of the sacred rites, and the whole celebration more clearly prefigures that heavenly liturgy which is enacted in the holy city of Jerusalem. Pastors of souls will therefore do all they can to achieve this form of celebration" (Musicam Sacram). Unlike any other art form, sacred music has the capacity to transform the hearts and minds of believers and non-believers. It is evangelization in its truest form.

### Prayer to Saint Joseph Before Mass

O Blessed Saint Joseph, to whom it was given not only to see and to hear that God Whom many kings long to see, and saw not, to hear, and heard not; but also to carry Him in your arms, to embrace Him, to clothe Him, and guard and defend Him, pray for me that I may unite myself completely with Him during this Holy Mass, worshipping Him in gratitude and joy.

O God, who have given us a royal priesthood, we beseech You, that as Blessed Joseph was found worthy to touch with his hands, and to bear in his arms, Your only-begotten Son, born of the Virgin Mary, so may we be made fit, by cleanness of heart and blamelessness of life, to approach your holy altar.

May we, this day, with reverent devotion, partake of the Sacred Body and Blood of Your only-begotten Son, and may we be accounted worthy of receiving an everlasting reward in the world to come. Amen.






### Cathedral Restoration Project
