***From the Pastor's Desk . . .***



As we enter this third Sunday of Lent, we are presented in the Gospel with the familiar scene of Jesus chasing out of the temple precincts those who have turned that area of prayer into an area of commerce. We find that Jesus is consumed, as we hear in the

Gospel, with zeal for God's house. This certainly is not the first time He was consumed with zeal for God's house. Recall when Mary and Joseph were in the caravan and they could not find their Son. When they finally locate Him in the temple it is Jesus who says to Mary: "why were You looking for Me? Did You not know I had to be in my Father's house?"

From the very beginning it was zeal that consumed the heart of Jesus. Does that zeal consume our hearts? Are we spending time in God's house, fruitful time? As we spend time in Adoration, is our heart consumed with zeal for prayer? As we sit in anticipation for the beginning of Mass, is our heart consumed with zeal? After we receive our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, is our heart consumed with zeal? We are in week three of our Lenten journey; examine your heart today. Last Sunday the disciples said to Jesus it is good that we are here. This week can we say the same?

**Wisdom of God in the Lives of the Saints  
by Fr. Dominic**

*“Fasting is directed to two things, the deletion of sin, and the raising of the mind to heavenly things.”*  
-Saint Thomas Aquinas

If there is one practice that Holy Mother Church never ceases to call Her children to frequently undergo, it is fasting. While fasting does have a particular requirement in application (one full meal and two small meals which do not equal a full meal without consumption of food in between meals) we should be able to discern that fasting is not limited to simply food. To limit ourselves in thinking that fasting can only be done with food would be to entirely miss its higher purpose and beauty. Let us examine the idea of fasting according to Saint Thomas. First, he reminds us of the sole two purposes of fasting: “the deletion of sin” and “the raising of the mind to heavenly things”. No matter what we are choosing to fast from, we must ask ourselves the simple questions of “Why am I fasting from this?” and “How is what I am fasting from helping me to remove sins in my life in order to grow in holiness?” The existence of Holy Mother Church is a visible sign calling all of us to forsake the way of sinning in order to walk in the way of the Gospel, namely the way of Life. In other words, we are all called to fast from inordinate and disorderly acts as they cause us to turn away from God. Hence, fasting is a practice of detachment from sins because they offend God. When we fast from sinning, we begin to strive toward the path of pleasing God and devote ourselves to remaining in that ever Divine Friendship with Him. A struggle to fast in an orderly manner, with regard to food, is only an indication of a greater weakness in a person, namely detachment to worldly things and pleasures. Heavenly things are food of the soul. For this reason, ‘one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God’ (Mt 4:4), because ‘it is the Spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life’ (Jn 6:63). With these words of encouragement, may our fasting practice this Lenten season pierce beyond the surface of food. May we fast with intentionality in order to dive deeper into the interiority of our hearts so that they may become humble, contrite, and above all an acceptable offering to the Lord!

### **Cantilene (from Sonata #11)**

### **Adagio (from Sonata #15)--Josef Rheinberger**



Both prelude pieces played before Mass this weekend were by nineteenth century German composer, Josef Rheinberger (1839-1901). Rheinberger is one of the

lesser known composers of organ and sacred music. However, especially in New England, it seems, his music is becoming more and more relevant liturgically and for concerts.

Rheinberger composed twenty sonatas for organ, which are multi movement pieces, (normally at least three or four), and although many of the opening and closing movements are more suitable for concerts, many of the middle, softer and/or slower movements, are very suitable for church use. Both pieces I will be playing for the Prelude before Mass are from two different sonatas. Generally as one ages, their music writing tends to become more complex. Rheinberger's Sonatas eleven through twenty are a lot more complex than the first ten, and often times, each movement is longer. As a whole, there are typically more movements in his later sonatas as well.

One of the reasons Rheinberger's music is receiving as much attention in the present time is because of its melodious nature in combination with its musical complexity (in relation to music composed prior to this era). It is also true that his later works allow the organist to explore more sounds from the instrument, overall. In addition to Rheinberger's organ music, he composed some really beautiful choral music, including Masses. The organ at St. Mary's was completed and installed in 1898. Therefore, much of the music of the 19th century and early 20th century is very suitable for our organ due to its tonal structure, along with the sounds the composers of that era were fond of and were familiar with.




