From the Pastor's Desk . . .



The summoning of the Twelve in the Gospel this weekend allows us to see that Jesus permitted the Twelve to share in an intimate way in His ministry.

He gave them authority to do great things. He instructed them on how they were to go and what they were called to do. They went forward in the same manner in which they received their initial calling. That is, they went immediately and did what He asked of them. There was no hesitation on their part; there were no litanies of questions; there were no expressions of fear and/or anxiety. They received His word and acted on it. This is a good reminder to us. Once we hear the Word of God, we need to respond to it with immediacy. The Twelve realized that if He was sending them out, then He would make the necessary provisions for them. There is much to learn from that! The bottom line of the Gospel is trust God. They took nothing with them except that reliance on and trust in God. Can we do likewise?

St. Andrew



St. Andrew was an Apostle, a fisherman from Bethsaida, and brother of Simon Peter. From Scripture, we learn that "Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his brother Simon and told him, 'we have found the Messiah.' Then he brought him to Jesus." (John 1:40-42) St. Andrew is the patron saint of fishermen and singers. He is also the patron saint to several countries and cities including Scotland, Romania, Russia, Ukraine, and Patras. The most common symbol of Andrew's portrait is usually a Latin cross (early tradition) or the more common saltire cross (later tradition) because he was crucified on an X-shaped cross. This cross is now his distinctive symbol. It's also the symbol of Scotland, and St. Andrew is the country's patron. His cross, in white on a blue background, remains the proud symbol of Scotland today and forms a central component of the Flag of the Union of Great Britain. His feast day is celebrated on November 30th.

Wisdom of God in the Lives of the Saints by Fr. Dominic

"If you want to obtain what you pray for, adapt yourself to it, that is, if you want humility, do not avoid humiliations." -Saint Anthony Mary Zaccaria

Happiness is an innate desire of all rational beings. It is neither a random phenomenon nor an invention of man. Rather, it is a desire which God placed within our hearts at the very moment He created us. By understanding this fundamental reality, we are better able to pray well with regards to making our petitions known to God. The good and the truth we yearn for are all in accordance with our well being and happiness because they are what God has desired for us from all of eternity. For this reason, when we are inclined to grow in virtue, it is important to recognize that it was not us who first desired this, but God. This is because He wills for us to be happy and ordains the ways in which we will attain that. This happiness comes to full fruition willing what God wills and as He wills it to be. Saint Anthony Mary Zaccaria reminds us of this and uses humility as an example. When we pray to grow in humility, we ought not only to pray for the grace to know the way in which God wills for us to do so, but also for the strength to embrace God's way. May we join with the psalmist in praying these words: "*make me know Your ways, Lord; Teach me Your paths. Lead me in Your truth and teach me, for You are the God of my salvation*" (Psalm 25:4-5) so that we may always recognize our need for God in order to attain the happiness which He desires for us.

Consecration to the Our Blessed Mother

Once again this summer we will be offering the opportunity for parishioners to join together for either a first time or a renewed Consecration to Mary. We will have copies of Fr. Michael Gaitley's *33 Days to Morning Glory* available in the Parish Center (they should arrive by July 10th). FROM the Choir Loft

This Sunday's Processional Hymn is "Christ is Made the Sure Foundation," a hymn that has been sung on two of the last three Sundays. Its author, John Mason Neale (1818-1866), was an English priest, author of several hymns, and scholar. He was also well-known for providing many English translations of several Latin and Greek hymns. He is perhaps most well-known for "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

Neale was in rather poor health most of his life, which prevented him from serving parishes; and due to his loyalty to Rome and support of the Oxford movement, he was either ignored or disliked by many of his contemporaries. He spent the last twenty years of his life as a warden of Sackville College in East Grinstead, a retirement home for poor men. He also founded the Sisterhood of St. Margaret, which became one of the finest English training orders for nurses.

The tune paired with Neale's text being sung this weekend is REGENT SQUARE, composed in 1866 by English organist and composer, Henry Smart (1813-1879). Smart gave up a career in the legal profession to assume a life in church music. Smart became completely blind by the age of fifty-two, but this did not hinder his abilities to play the organ or serve as a church musician.

"Christ is Made the Sure Foundation" contains a message that is broad, yet simple and can be incorporated into many liturgies throughout the church year, including that of the Easter season, Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and several Sundays in Ordinary Time. Its themes of "Christ as head of the Church," "salvation," and "eternal life through the Glory of The Trinity" are also referenced in the Psalm (85), and in the second reading (Ephesians 1:3 -14). The simplicity of the melody, including its largely stepwise movement, rhythmic repetition and simplicity, along with the text, make this hymn and its tune an invaluable piece of music for liturgical use in any parish.


