From the Pastor's Desk . . .




When asked what is the first of all the Commandments, Jesus responds: "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength." These words from the Old Testament, which are part of today's First Reading, were familiar to the Jewish people. It was part of the "Shema" which was prayed twice daily.

For us as for them, these words are the summation and culmination of all the other Commandments. In other words, all that we say and do must be dependent on and rooted in our love for God. Everything else proceeds from this Commandment. Pope John Paul I (Cardinal Luciani) wrote regarding love of God: "The man who loves God must board the ship of God, determined to accept the course set by His Commandments, by the guidance of those who represent Him and by the situations and circumstances of life that He permits." We live and demonstrate our love for God by faithfully carrying out charity in all of our duties and responsibilities in the world. If lived in this manner, our love we have for God will spill over into our love for others. Let us live and love in this fashion.

SIGNATURE CAMPAIGN TO PROTECT BORN-ALIVE INFANTS FINAL WEEKEND

Did you know that under the Roe Act (different from Roe v. Wade) passed last year by the Massachusetts Legislature, a child born alive in Massachusetts has no legal right to self-sustaining medical care? A signature campaign is underway to propose a law protecting children born alive, particularly during an abortion. If/when enough signatures (85,000) are gathered, the initiative petition question will appear on the November 2022 ballot. This proposed law would require all reasonable steps in keeping with good medical practice be taken to preserve the life of a child born alive. Parishioners will be collecting signatures during the month of October. Please consider signing this very important petition.

Wisdom of God in the Lives of the Saints

“Christian perfection consists in three things: praying heroically, working heroically, and suffering heroically.”

-Saint Anthony Mary Claret



Saint Anthony Mary Claret succinctly tells us how we ought to live our lives in order to attain this perfection and sanctity. Not only is it spelled out for us, but we must also recognize that God provides us with sufficient grace in order to attain that perfection. If sanctity is not achieved, it is simply because we have gotten in the way of our very own selves. Nothing was, is, or

ever will be lacking from God. In *Contra Gentiles*, Saint Thomas Aquinas speaks of this twofold reality, *“for God, so far as is in Him, is ready to give grace to all...but they alone are deprived of grace who set up an impediment to grace in themselves”* (Book 3 Chapter 159). We must always bear in mind that God will never call nor command us to do the impossible for as He tells us *“I am with you always, even to the end of time”* (Matthew 28:20) and *“with God all things are possible”* (Matthew 19: 26). When we are commanded to pray unceasingly, to do the work of God, or to suffer injustice and persecution for the love of God, then we ought to do so humbly, swiftly, and heroically. May we respond generously to the graces of God with the same words of our Lord, *“not my will, but yours be done”* (Luke 22:44) and Our Lady, *“be it unto me according to thy word”* (Luke 1:38).

If you attend the 9:00am or 11:00am Masses on Sunday mornings, I think you will agree that both the adult and children's choirs are off to a really solid start this Fall. When I was hired as Music Director almost five years ago, I started with a children's choir of six girls.

We have doubled the number of children to twelve, and we now have a male, in addition to just myself! While the Adult Choir is in a rebuilding phase, following the Covid-19 pandemic, I am pleased to say that we have expanded the number of male singers this year, something that had been my goal since I was hired. In my first year as the choir director, we had no tenor singers, which made much of the repertoire in the parish library unsingable. I had to sing the tenor part in our music where it was feasible, while playing and directing the choir. We now have three tenors in our choir, and the tenors now outnumber the Alto and Bass sections!

While we are off to a solid start this program year, we welcome more adults and children to join our choir ministry. We have a handful of both children and adults who have never sung in a choir until this fall and they are doing just fine! In the weeks to follow, we will include more testimonials from our singers in the bulletin, including what drew them to the ministry, what about it is important to them, and why they feel the choirs are important in the life of the parish.


