
From the Pastor's Desk . . .

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

On November 9th, Tuesday of this week, we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. The structure as it now stands was commissioned in 1646 by Pope Innocent X after human and natural causes had all but destroyed the original church. The façade is striking, with fifteen monumental statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist and twelve doctors of the Church lining the perimeter of the roof. Beneath the high altar are the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

Loyola Press provides the following explanation of this feast day, which the Church has been celebrating for centuries:

Christians first met in homes to hear Jesus’ teachings and to celebrate the Eucharist. When the Christians were no longer persecuted for their faith, they built beautiful churches. Sometime before the fourth century, a palace owned by a noble Roman family named Laterani had been built. It became the property of the Emperor Constantine. Constantine had recognized Christianity as the religion of the empire, and he donated to the Church the palace and other buildings on the site. This became Rome’s oldest church. It was given the title Basilica of the Savior, but later was dedicated to John the Baptist and called St. John Lateran.

St. John Lateran was the home of the popes – the center of the Catholic world for many years. Twenty-eight popes were buried there. Although our pope now lives at the Vatican and presides at St. Peter’s basilica, St. John Lateran is considered his cathedral as the bishop of Rome. The dedication of this basilica is a happy occasion for the Church because it reminds us of our beginnings, our unity. It stands as a monument to God and all that God does through the Church.

In order to dispel the darkness of a room, one must rely on light. This light can either come from a burning candle, a flashlight or an electrical light. Similarly, the darkness of sin and evil can only be overcome by two kinds of light. The first is the natural light of reason, while the second is the supernatural light of Faith. Although the natural light of reason has its own beauty and radiance, it pales in comparison to the illustrious light of Faith. It is precisely this supernatural light that one needs in order to advance safely through the darkness of this life, toward the heavenly homeland. The darkness of this life consists of confusions, lies, persecutions, divisions, etc. all of which are caused by the enemies, both visible and invisible. The enemies are opposed to the Faith. Though the darkness might be great, it will always be extinguished by the light of Faith, for those who remain steadfast in it. Saint John reminds us that *“The victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who [indeed] is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?”* (1 Jn 5:4-5). We have witnessed this reality in the lives of the saints throughout the ages. May we hold fast to the same Faith professed by all the holy men and women who have gone before us and let that same light of Faith shine brightly in our lives.

If you attend the 9:00am or 11:00am Masses on Sunday mornings, I think you will agree that both the adult and children's

choirs are off to a really solid start this Fall. When I was hired as Music Director almost five years ago, I started with a children's choir of six girls. We have doubled the number of children to twelve, and we now have a male, in addition to just myself! While the Adult Choir is in a rebuilding phase following the Covid-19 pandemic, I am pleased to say that we have expanded the number of male singers this year, something that had been my goal since I was hired. In my first year as the choir director, we had no tenor singers, which made much of the repertoire in the parish library unsingable. I had to sing the tenor part in our music where it was feasible, while playing and directing the choir. We now have three tenors in our choir, and the tenors now outnumber the Alto and Bass sections!

While we are off to a solid start this program year, we welcome more adults and children to join our choir ministry. We have a handful of both children and adults who have never sung in a choir until this fall and they are doing just fine! In the weeks to follow, we will include more testimonials from our singers in the bulletin, including what drew them to the ministry, what about it is important to them, and why they feel the choirs are important in the life of the parish.


