From the Pastor's Desk . . .



"They prostrated themselves and did Him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." The Gospel today, although a

familiar one for the Christmas Season, should cause us to pause and reflect about the gift. On the night of Christ's birth, the shepherds came in from the field and presumably they did not come empty handed. They would have carried gifts of milk, eggs, cheese, a small lamb, or some other small animal. These were simple, humble gifts, yet greatly received. I am confident that the townsfolk who came to see the Christ Child would have brought something also to Him. Today, the Three Wise Men come from the east and carry gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. At first glance, these three gifts would seem more valuable than the others. They would be perceived to have greater worth. Yet, in the eyes of Christ, any gift offered is precious and appreciated. Which begs the question, what gift are we ready to offer to the Child in the Manger? Remember, that in the eyes of Christ every gift is of great value. So, before we make New Year resolutions that we have no intention of keeping, let us resolve that we will bring a gift to the Child today. Perhaps it may be the gift of spending a few moments in the Adoration Chapel, or praying with your family before meals, or even a decade of the Rosary with your friends. Whatever the gift, offer it and see the Child smile.

JANUARY

We are entering into a new calendar year and in the month ahead, there is, as always, much to celebrate and reflect upon. Here are some highlights for the first month of 2022:

The month of January is dedicated to *The Holy Name of Jesus*, which is celebrated on January 3rd. The first nine days of January fall during the liturgical season of Christmas, which is represented by the color white – the color of light and a symbol of joy, purity and innocence. The remaining days of the month begin the season of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the color green, the symbol of hope and life.

The Holy Father's Intentions for the month of January, 2022: For true human fraternity – we pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

The Gospels for the Sundays in January during the Christmas season follow the annual readings from St. Matthew, St. Luke, and St. John. The remaining Sunday Gospels in Ordinary Time are taken from St. Luke following Cycle C; the weekday readings follow Year II.


