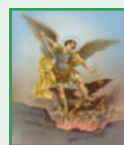

Just imagine, however, sitting at the feet of Jesus and looking into His eyes. Imagine for a moment hearing what His voice sounds like. Imagine completely abandoning yourself and adoring Him. Imagine tending to Christ and waiting on Him as opposed to the other way around. Well, you really don't have to imagine that for very long. We are blessed here at St. Mary's to have many excellent opportunities to do just that each and every day. You can be in His presence, listen to His voice, adore Him, and tend to Him. This encounter with the Lord begins with Mass and continues beyond the Mass in the Perpetual Adoration Chapel. The Better Part

This Sunday's Gospel (Luke 10:38-42) is a familiar one; the meaning behind Jesus' words to Martha is a great conversation starter and there are many thought provoking reflections on this passage. The story is about two sisters, Martha and Mary, and how they respond to Jesus' arrival at their home. Hospitality is of huge importance within the first century Jewish community where the sisters live. Martha is intent on fulfilling her duties as hostess and is unhappy with Mary for choosing to sit by Jesus and listen to him rather than helping with the preparation and serving of their meal. Jesus responds to Martha's complaints with the following well known words: *"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her"* (vv 41-42).

One of my favorite sources for our weekly Gospel Study is a book of reflections on the four Gospels by Fr. John Bartunek entitled *The Better Part*. I didn't realize the title he chose was in reference to the aforementioned verse until I was preparing for the Gospel Study. I guess I'm a little slow on the uptake! Here's a paragraph taken from his reflection on this week's Gospel that may help with its meaning and applicability.

"Christ was happy to be served, but he was even happier to be loved. He yearns for our love. When we come before him at the final judgment, he will be less interested in our resume of achievements than in the love with which we achieved them. He was happy that Mary wanted to listen to him, wanted to sit beside him and spend time with him. That is why he became man in the first place – to make himself available, to offer his friendship. This desire was so strong that he invented a way to extend his real presence to all times and places through the sacrament of the Eucharist. In every tabernacle throughout the world he is available 24/7, just for us, just because he loves us."

Wisdom of God in the Lives of the Saints

"What dear brothers, is more delightful than the voice of the Lord calling to us?"

-Saint Benedict of Nursia

When people see or hear the phrase *"the voice of the Lord"*, the common follow-up question is *"what does the voice of the Lord sound like?"*. Oftentimes we tend to imagine the voice of the Lord to be something audible. While it is true that God has communicated in an audible manner to His faithful servants throughout the ages, we often forget that His voice is not limited nor restricted to the mode of sound. On the contrary, a rational creature endowed with an intellect and a will knows the voice of God is heard in both truth and grace. God is always speaking to us; however, the effects of His speech depend on the receivers. When a rightly ordered soul meditates on the truths concerning God and the mysteries of the Faith, it is filled with delights because the grace of God speaks to the depth of its being and unites the soul to God. To a soul that is indifferent and lukewarm to the truth, the voice of God will have adverse effects where the soul finds it to be boring, bitter, or even painful. For this reason, it is very important that we examine our conscience daily in order to remove all the things that may impede us from receiving, embracing, and taking delight in the "voice" of God.

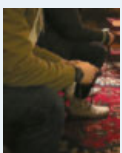
Parish Book Club

Just yesterday, the Church celebrated the **Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel**. Perhaps you have heard of the **Carmelite Order** or even of St. Simon Stock. **On July 16, 1251 Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock**, who at the time was Fr. General, and presented him with a **scapular** for the Carmelites with the following promise, saying : "*Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee*

and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace" (Catholic News Agency). Scapular comes from the latin word "scapula" meaning "shoulder". It is a **devotional** worn by many Catholics. 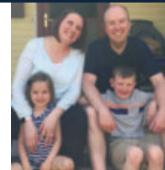
