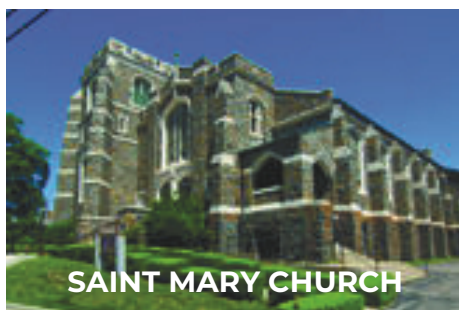

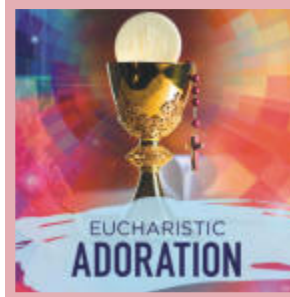

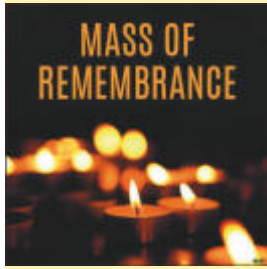

SCRIPTURE STUDY

Come study the Bible with us! As Catholics, do we realize that the Bible is OUR book? We invite you to come, journey with us as we walk with Jesus through Sacred Scripture, just as the disciples did on the road to Emmaus that Easter Sunday evening.

We begin the walk in October, uncovering the foundation of Eucharist that extends further back in salvation history than we may realize, and continues through the New Testament.

As the Eucharist grounds us as Catholics, we then retell the birth narratives and Christmas customs in December. Everyone adores a new baby! What makes one particular little guy so special? Do all of those characters really appear in the one manger scene we're accustomed to seeing?

In March and April, we'll look at the Passion and Resurrection Narratives, the culmination of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection for our salvation. Can we make this walk with Jesus? Can we identify ourselves with any of the characters in the story?

Act One, Act Two, or Act Three? Well, none of the above! We're not talking about that kind of act, but rather, acts as works. What were the Apostles up to in the early Church? How did the Church function and grow? The Easter season in late April and May affords us an opportunity to take a peek and see what the Bible has to say!

The sessions will be held on Saturday mornings from 10 AM to noon in the lower church hall at Sacred Heart. The presenter is Barbara Sullivan, well known for her Biblical knowledge and teaching. Barbara also is a parishioner here at Divine Mercy.

Regardless of the state of the economy, whether growing or sluggish, the presence of the poor remains a constant reality. Over the years, the Society provided assistance to many people in need. Most often the need is for food, but as the cost of living has risen and several layoffs affecting our people have taken place, other needs have increased. Requests for clothing, fuel/utility assistance, and rental help have become more common. Also, when major disasters (hurricanes, earthquakes, etc.) occur in other areas of the country or the world, the Society responds with as much financial assistance as their means permit.
