BISHOP DA CUNHA & REGIONAL BISHOPS TO LIFT THE SUNDAY & HOLY DAY MASS DISPENSATION

Bishop Edgar M. da Cunha, S.D.V., and regional Catholic bishops have together decided to inform the Catholic faithful that the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation will be lifted on Father's Day, June 19-20.

The bishops saw Father's Day weekend as an appropriate time to encourage Catholic faithful, especially families, to return to the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, the center of every Catholic life.

The obligation does not apply to those who are ill, recently exposed to COVID-19 or other communicable illnesses, those confined to their homes or other facilities for various reasons, and those who are not able to be vaccinated for specific reasons.

The full official release of the bishops' statement will be posted on The Anchor website at <u>anchornews.org</u>, the diocesan website at <u>fallriverdiocese.org</u>, and on the parish website as well.

DISPENSATION REMAINS FOR FAMILY WITH CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 12

The Bishop's statement makes it clear that those who are not yet able to be vaccinated (that would include families with children under 12 or who have members who cannot be vaccinated), the obligation to attend Mass does NOT apply. This may change in the fall when, hopefully, children will be able to receive the vaccination.

RESTRICTIONS LIFTED

Following the directives we received from the Diocese, the weekend of, May 29/30, we went back to the "new normal." This will include the following:

- No need to register to attend Mass; simply come;
- The ropes will be off the pews;
- All entrances will be accessible;
- Masks are no longer required; if you wish to continue to wear one, that is up to you.
- For those who are unvaccinated please continue to wear masks and keep the 6 foot distance;
- Hymnals and music books are at each of the pews;
- Congregational singing will resume;
- The Offertory procession (bringing up the gifts) will resume;
- There will be 4 Communion stations 2 at the top of the center aisle and 2 at the break. You will approach the Minister of Communion from the center aisle and return by the side aisle, as we did prior to the pandemic;
- You may receive Communion on the tongue if you wish.

While the restrictions are being lifted, the dispensation from the obligation of attending Mass continues until further notice.

I do want to thank all of you for your patience during this incredibly difficult period. I want to thank you again for your continued generosity to the Parish. It has been a blessing. Lastly, I want to thank the Knights for sanitizing the Church after each weekend Mass, and a special thank you to Charlie Spath for overseeing that project.
