

SYNOD OF BISHOPS

The Synod of Bishops is entitled: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." Its long-term goal is to re-orient the local Church toward an inherent synodal attitude in decision-making processes through communion, participation, and mission. It began last weekend in Rome.

It will include a Diocesan phase. Bishop da Cunha celebrated a Synod Opening Mass at 10:30 a.m. last Sunday, October 17. He has asked that all parishes celebrate the Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit marking the beginning of this special year. We have included a detailed description of the Synod, and more information will be provided in the next few weeks.

SYNOD 2021

On October 9-10th, Pope Francis celebrated the official opening of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops and launched the Synodal process in the Church around the world.

Literally speaking, the word "synod", derived from two Greek words *syn* meaning "together" and *hodos* meaning "road" or "way", means a "coming together."

The Synod of Bishops was instituted by Pope Saint Paul VI on September 15, 1965 with the *Motu Proprio Apostolica Sollicitudo*. Its establishment took place in the context of the Second Vatican Council, with the Dogmatic Constitution *Lumen Gentium*. (cf. *General Secretariat for the Synod of Bishops*)

A synod is not meant to be a "parliament", and the synodal process is not simply a matter of canvassing participants and counting votes. In a synod, the point is discerning, not the will of the people, but the will of the Holy Spirit, for the Spirit in that context is sovereign, or in the language of Pope Francis, the "protagonist." (cf. *Bishop Barron, "What is Synodality?"*)

In particular, a synod is understood as a process divided into three phases: the *preparatory phase*, in which the consultation of the People of God on the topics indicated by the Roman Pontiff takes place; the *celebratory phase*, characterized by the assembly of the Bishops; and the *implementation phase*, in which the conclusions of the synod approved by the Roman Pontiff are implemented in the Church. (cf. *General Secretariat for the Synod of Bishops*)

The Diocesan Synodal phase is the first step within the *preparatory phase*, inviting the local Church to gather, listen, and share so that we are able to better "journey together" as Church in living our baptismal mission.

Our involvement in the Synodal process comes from the fact that each parish family is part of a diocesan family, which is in turn part of a universal, Catholic family.

The Synod's long-term goal is to re-orient the local Church toward an inherent synodal attitude in decision making processes through communion, participation, and mission. (cf. *USCCB, Checklist and Background Materials*)

In a general way, we should utilize this time as an opportunity to take stock of where we are as a Church after the past year and discern, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the best path forward to proclaim the Gospel.

Consider the possibility of a vocation to the priesthood, diaconate, or religious life

DIOCESAN UPDATE ON THE COVID-19 RESPONSE

As most of you know, on Tuesday, July 27, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced a change to its mask-wearing guidance and now advises that fully vaccinated persons wear a mask in indoor public places, in areas of the country with "substantial and high" transmission of Covid-19. This is to reduce the risk of being infected with the more transmissible Delta variant of the virus and possibly spreading it to others.

Currently almost all territory of the Fall River Diocese lies in counties classified as either "substantial" or "high" areas of community transmission. In light of this, the Diocese of Fall River is **strongly encouraging all parishioners** to follow the CDC guidance and to wear a mask while attending Mass or any other liturgical celebration unless unable because of a medical condition or under the age of two. This is particularly important for anyone with a weakened immune system; anyone at risk for severe disease because of age or underlying medical condition; or anyone in a household with someone having these conditions or with someone who is unvaccinated.

The recent uptick in virus transmission in some places is a reminder that the pandemic has not yet passed, and continued vigilance is required. Parishioners are asked to please keep in mind the need for a collective commitment to the overall good of the parish community.

The Diocese of Fall River continues to monitor all Covid-19 advisories and orders by both the CDC and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and will amend diocesan guidelines and directives on an ongoing basis as needed.

Read Today's Gospel: Mk 10:46-52


Question for Adults: What does it mean for you to "see"? Are there blind spots in your life?


