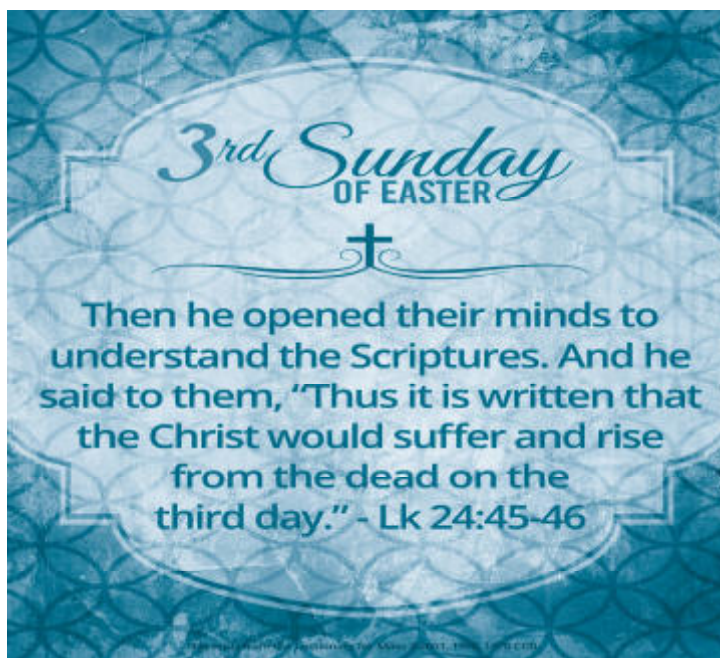

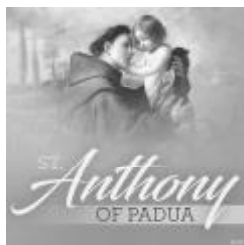

From the
Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

In the plan of the Gospel, the mystery of Divine Mercy comes first, and repentance follows. It's not as if we keep the Law, carefully observing all its precepts, and God rewards us with His favor and blessings. No! *"The author of life (we) put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses... God has thus brought to fulfillment what He had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that His Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."*

The importance of God's method cannot be overestimated! First, Jesus says, *"Father, forgive them, they do not know what they do."* And then the Good Thief says, *"Jesus, remember me, when you come into your kingdom."* (Lk 24:34, 42). First, Jesus says to the woman caught in adultery, *"Neither do I condemn thee,"* and then he says, *"Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."* (Jn 8:11). First, *"Jesus is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world,"* and then we keep his commandments (1 Jn 2:3). First, Jesus three times asks Peter, *"Do you love me?"* and then three times commissions him to *"Feed my lambs; tend my sheep; feed my sheep; i.e., follow me."* Jn 21:15-19, or as this is prophesied by Jesus in Luke's Gospel: *"Simon, Simon, behold Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat, but I have prayed that your own faith may not fail: and once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers."* (Lk 22:31-32).

Now that it is our turn, chastened by the collapse of everything once taken for granted, we can actually be *"witnesses of these things"* as Jesus *"opens our minds to understand the Scriptures"* that the fruit of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection for us is repentance, meaning a completely new attitude towards life that God intends for us as His beloved sons and daughters. We are *"witnesses"* to this, every time we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Yet, there is more! The last verse in the periscope from today's Gospel is: *"And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."* (Lk 24:49). Pentecost is coming! Let us pray!

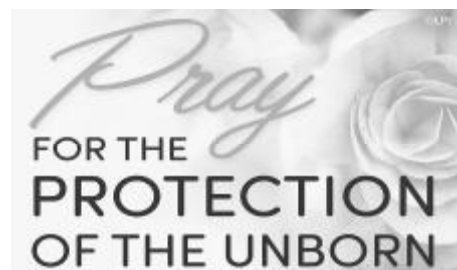
