From Deacon Joe MacDonald

Some years ago, many pastoral councils began to work on "mission statements" for their parishes. Scores of people, in countless churches, put a lot of hours into the composition of these "mission statements" and it baffles me – just a little bit. It baffles me because our "mission statement" was written over 2000 years ago by Christ himself. We just heard one version of that statement in today's gospel.

"As the Father has sent me, I also send you."

We heard the Lord say something similar and more direct last week when we celebrated the feast of the Ascension – This should really be a church's mission statement, the one of every parish bulletin. It's the last thing Christ said on earth and it was this:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

You know what this means?

We are NOT a couch potato Church. We are sent. All of us have work to do. Our mission statement is all about mission. We are a missionary church.

Today's gospel finds the disciples cowering in a locked room out of fear; fear that they might get labeled as one of "His" followers. But all they really accomplished was to place themselves in a kind of self-imprisonment where they were in danger of becoming the first-century equivalent of a couch potato.

But Jesus can't be locked out, and he can't be locked in either.

How often do we place ourselves in some kind of spiritual or religious self-imprisonment, locking out the world around us, fearful that we too might get labeled as one of "His" followers? The fear is justifiable too. The world is hostile to Christians, especially Catholics, even though that hostility may be more subtle than it was in the first century. We don't want to be mocked or labeled as inflexible, or as following some ancient religion that has no connection to the modern world.

We are a lot like the disciples. Locked in our own fears and avoiding our own mission to go out and make disciples of all

us, that he loves us, and offers us salvation and fullness of life, peace and joy.

Jesus is speaking to us today, in the same way and with the same words he spoke to the disciples. He's come to us through our own closed doors and says "Peace. I - send - you"

Jesus knew it wouldn't be easy for the disciples and that it wouldn't be easy for us either so he gave us something. A gift that would transform us, give us courage, give us enthusiasm and the desire to share what we ourselves have been given.

The feast we celebrate today, the feast of Pentecost, is all about God outpouring on the Church (on us-all of us) His very Spirit. We have within us the very life of the divine creator, the savior and sanctifier. That Holy Spirit spills forth in the Church with every gift, every tool needed for us, as Church, to accomplish our mission.

We were given that Holy Spirit at baptism and it was strengthened and brought to completion in us at our Confirmation. The same Holy Spirit abides in our marriages and our vocations, but sometimes we forgotten that or we forget how to recognize Him. Sometimes the Spirit lays dormant in us.

But just like the event we read about today the Holy Spirit can be poured out on us anew moving us from fear to courage; from impotence to action; from being voiceless to becoming orators for Christ.

The last thing the deacon says at Mass, the very last thing we hear at any Mass, echoes the words of Christ in today's Gospel when the Lord offered the disciples peace and sent them into the world. The deacon says these or similar words, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." After every Mass we are sent! Sent not to watch our child's baseball game; sent not to play soccer or eat at a restaurant or visit grandma, or go to school, although that's exactly where we might find ourselves. Our mission is to bring Christ to that ballgame, bring Christ to the soccer field and the restaurant, to school or to grandma's house.

If I could offer a suggestion today - let's take the verse from today's Gospel Acclamation home with us and make it our prayer this week.

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in us the fire of your divine love."

So that when we hear the words "I send YOU!" We can respond with voices raised, walking shoes tied, and courage in our hearts to proclaim to the world in the Holy Spirit, no matter the cost, the truth - that Jesus Christ is Lord.

June 5, 2022 - Pentecost Sunday


Even though Pentecost is rightly celebrated in late spring, the robust experience of a New England fall can provide a profound metaphor for reflection. A full expression of fall colors is beautiful to behold. But, with all of its majesty and beauty, the observer knows the experience of death is soon to come. Creation will be dark and barren for a while. Pentecost cannot be separated from the cross. Before God's transformative, life-giving power can bear fruit, we must first die.

Pentecost is all about leaving the lifeless dead wood behind and allowing God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to create something new. These Pentecost creations happen repeatedly over and over again. The birthing process of the Church is ongoing. God is always bringing life out of death and creating something where there was once nothing. That is why the fall is such an apropos metaphorical season for Pentecost. In order to really receive the gift of the Holy Spirit we have to die to what we once knew and what no longer works.

When fire and wind find their fullest expression, they are in no way gentle nor kind. They have the potential to level anything in their paths. We are experiencing great turmoil in our world, nation, and our Church. Whether the result of circumstance or the work of the Holy Spirit, much of what we knew to be normal and constant is changing. Common systems and institutional structures that may have worked for a time no longer do. When the old and familiar need to be left behind, God creates something new. Change and disorder do not need to be our enemies. They always bring opportunities for something exciting and new. What we need is untiring faith, firm hope, and perfect love.

What we need is for the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to see what is important and what we must do. "O Holy Spirit, descend plentifully into my heart. Enlighten the dark corners of this neglected dwelling and scatter there Thy cheerful beams." (St. Augustine) If we experience joy, even in the midst of turbulence, then we will know we are exactly where God needs us to be. If not, then perhaps there is a lesson in the decaying leaves that graciously descend to the ground on a crisp fall day. ©LPi


