WORD OF GOD SUNDAY, JANUARY 23rd

In 2019, Pope Francis in his apostolic letter "Aperuit Illis", instituted the Sunday of the Word of God and declared that it should be celebrated on the third Sunday in Ordinary Time.

"He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures" (Lk 24:45). This was one of the final acts of the risen Lord before his Ascension. Jesus appeared to the assembled disciples, broke bread with them and opened their minds to the understanding of the sacred Scriptures. The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth. Yet the contrary is equally true: without the Scriptures, the events of the mission of Jesus and his Church in this world would remain incomprehensible. Hence, St. Jerome could rightly claim: "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

"Yet another challenge raised by sacred Scripture has to do with love. God's word constantly reminds us of the merciful love of the Father who calls his children to live in love. The life of Jesus is the full and perfect expression of his divine love, which holds nothing back, but offers itself to all without reserve.

Along our path of welcoming God's word into our hearts, the Mother of the Lord accompanies us. She is the one who was called blessed because she believed in the fulfilment of what the Lord had spoken to her (cf. Lk 1:45). Mary's own beatitude is prior to all the beatitudes proclaimed by Jesus....the poor are not blessed because they are poor; they become blessed, if like Mary, they believe in the fulfilment of God's word. A great disciple and master of sacred scripture, St. Augustine, once wrote: "Someone in the midst of the crowd, seized with enthusiasm, cried out "Blessed is the womb that bore you" and Jesus replied, "Rather, blessed are they who hear the word of God and keep it." As if to say, "My mother, whom you call blessed, is indeed blessed, because she keeps the word of God. Not because in her the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, but because she keeps the same word of God by which she was made and which, in her womb, became flesh.

May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old," This word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance." (Dt. 30:14).




