

### **Message From Father Jacobs**

Thirty Days Hath September, also sometimes known as "The Days of the Month," is a rhyme used to remember how many days there are in a certain month. The use of "hath" instead of the

modern "has" leads us to think that the origins of this rhyme date back to the 16th century at least. Indeed, a variant of this popular rhyme first appeared in written form in 1577 when William Harrison, the priest, referred to it as "Thirty Days Hath November":

> Thirty days hath September, April, June and November; All the rest have thirty-one, Excepting February alone. Which only has but twenty-eight days clear And twenty-nine in each leap year.

### Saint Blaise, Bishop & Martyr Thursday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>



Saint Blaise was a physician, bishop of Sebaste (Turkey), and martyr who was born sometime in the 3rd century and died around the year 316. The earliest written reference to him doesn't appear until the 5th or 6th century, where he is reputed to have healed a boy who was choking on a fish bone. For this reason, his intercession is invoked for illnesses of the throat, and it is customary for throats to be blessed on his memorial, using crossed candles. The instruments of his martyrdom were steel combs that would

normally have been used to comb wool, and for this reason he is the patron saint of the wool trade.

### A "collective" Blessing of Throats will take place after each Mass the weekend of Feb. 5-6.
