**Message From Father Jacobs**



I read this story recently and want to share it with you all.

**A Glass of Milk**

*A young boy who was very poor was walking home one day. Desperate for something to drink, he knocked on the door of a farmhouse. A woman answered the door. "Can I help you?"*

*The boy was nervous and shy. "Please, ma'am. I'm very hungry, and I only have a few pennies, but is there any way I could buy a glass of milk from you?"*

*The woman smiled. "Wait here." She came back a few minutes later with a large glass of milk and a sandwich. She invited the boy in, where he sat at her table and ravenously ate and drank everything.*

*"Thank you, ma'am," he said, standing up when he finished. "How much do I owe you?"*

*"You owe me nothing," the woman said with a smile, "My mother taught me never to accept payment for being kind." The boy thanked her again and left.*

*Years passed. One day the woman, now much older, got sick with a mysterious illness. She spent days in bed before she could even get to a doctor, who looked her over and sent her to another doctor in the village. In time, all the local doctors examined her, but they didn't know what she had or how to cure her. Finally, they sent her to a hospital in the nearest big city.*

*The doctors there couldn't diagnose the illness either, so they contacted specialists from around the country to come and try to solve the mystery. One doctor came in for a consultation, and when he saw the name of the woman's hometown, he asked to see her. It took him only a glance to recognize the woman who had once given him a glass of milk and a sandwich and asked for nothing in return. **Wednesday, September 11th—Patriot Day  
National Day of Remembrance and Mourning**

On this day, people in the USA recall the terrorist attacks of 2001, when hijacked commercial airliners flew into the Pentagon and the two World Trade Center towers in New York City, and crashed near Shanksville, PA, killing 2,977 people. Firefighters and other first responders died and succumbed to lung contamination and trauma-related stress. In reaction to the event, the USA invaded Iraq and Afghanistan, resulting in the deaths of thousands of military personnel and uncounted numbers of civilians.



President George W. Bush proclaimed this day as Patriot Day on September 4, 2002. The flag is flown at half-staff, and at 8:46 a.m., Americans are to observe a moment of silence (the time when the first plane struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center). Others who lost loved ones visit their graves or attend special memorial services. On the 10th anniversary of this tragic event, the 911 Memorial located at Ground Zero was opened to the public.

**Grandparents Day**

Marian McQuade of Fayette County, West Virginia, had a great idea. Reflecting on the many lonely elderly people in nursing homes, she decided to create a special day of the year when children could tap into the resource of wisdom and heritage that those elderly have to offer. In 1978, President Jimmy Carter signed National Grandparents Day into law.

Mrs. McQuade died in 2008 at the age of 91, but some of her 15 children and 43 grandchildren still offer service to the National Grandparents Day Council. Now, variants of Grandparents Day exist in Australia, Canada, and several European nations. Many grammar schools offer Grandparents Day activities, encouraging children to create scrapbooks, essays, posters, poems, videotapes, or websites to tell their grandparents' stories. In 2024, Grandparents Day falls on September 8.

In response to questions regarding how to handle the panhandlers and homeless solicitors at highway ramps and in the community, Officer Barrett stressed DO NOT GIVE CASH. The cash will most likely be used for drugs which can possibly lead to an overdose. You are not helping anyone that way. You can offer to buy them a sandwich or meal, give a DD gift card, or suggest they get a meal at many of the area soup kitchens or a sandwich at St. Patrick/St. Anthony Church from 4-5:30 PM. We pray that each one of us will hear and take to heart the cry of the Earth and of victims of natural disasters and climactic change, and that all will undertake to personally care for the world in which we live.

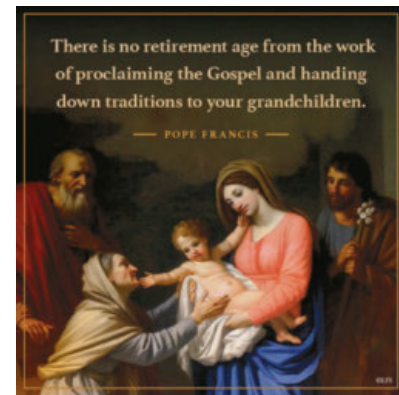

### Sunday, September 8th Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Exactly nine months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (December 8th), we come to an observance in honor of Mary's birth. This is one of only three birthdays in the Church's calendar, the other two being the birthdays of Jesus and of John the Baptist. This solemnity, like all Marian days, "is less about Mary than it is about the wonderous work of God in Mary. As Saint Andrew of Crete said in a homily long ago, "The present festival, the birth of the Mother of God, is the prelude, while the final act is the foreordained union of the Word with flesh... Justly then do we celebrate this mystery since it signifies for us a double grace ... Today this created world is raised to the dignity of a holy place for him who made all things. The creature is newly prepared to be a divine dwelling place for the Creator" (Office of Readings, Vol. IV, P. 1371).

### Thursday, September 12th Optional Memorial of the Most Holy Name of Mary

Three days after the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Church observes an optional memorial honoring the Most Holy Name of Mary. In Hebrew, the name Mary is "Miryam," or "Miriam," which means bitter sea." The name is an important one for the Jewish people: Miriam, the sister of Moses, sang in thanksgiving to God after the crossing of the Red Sea, and it was a common name for Jewish women (in the Gospel account of the Resurrection of Jesus, three women visit the tomb in the rock and all of them are named Mary!). In the Middle Ages, the name Mary was often translated as "star of the sea," a title with which Mary continues to be honored today.
