Some of you reading this, those with grey or follicly challenged hair, might remember something growing up called the Baltimore Catechism.

For those of you who don't know about this Catechism it was something that Catholic elementary schools used to teach religion. For me that was in the 1960's. The format was this: there would be a question like "Who made us?" and it would give us the answer, "God made us." "Why did God make us?" and we would answer "God made us to know, love and serve him in this world and to be happy with Him forever in the next." Those are the kinds of questions we would get in the first grade.

In the second grade, when we were about to receive the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist for the first time, we were asked this, "What is a Sacrament?" Good question, isn't it? If you never used the Baltimore Catechism, there's a good chance you can't come up with an answer. Sure, some of you can describe a sacrament and name some of them but an actual definition is going to be harder to come up with. Here's the answer we learned from the Baltimore Catechism.

"A Sacrament is an outward sign,
instituted by Christ to give grace."

The outward sign is something we can experience with our senses. It was given to us by Christ, who, as God, alone has the power and authority to impart grace. And grace is that free gift from God that makes us holy and gives us the strength to live the kind of life Christians are called to. Some sacraments, like Holy Orders, are vocational. So, too, is marriage.

I remember the day I "got" married. Many of you remember the day you "got" married or the day someone in your circle of friends "got" married. The thing is, too often we look at marriage this way, as something we get – one and done. That's not marriage.

We get the measles. We get the blue ribbon at the bake-off. Marriage has to be more than this or Christ wouldn't have made such a big deal about it in today's gospel.

Marriage is more than just something we get? What if marriage is more than something that happened to us; more than just a legal document; what if by God's grace marriage is something we become?

Let me propose this. Together married couples are that outward sign, instituted by Christ on their wedding day, to bring God's grace into the world. By entering into this vocation, couples are commissioned to bring the love they share to the world around them, by the way they live their marriages, raise their children, treat their neighbors, care for the needy, and worship their God.

A Christian husband and wife agree to lay down their lives for each other in all kinds of ways, just as Christ did.

Sometimes in our marriages we find ourselves in circumstances that seem to just suck the ever-living life out of us. Our tanks are empty, and we're running on fumes. That's when husbands and wives must be willing to give that last drop, that last bit of what you have left inside for the well-being of the other. Marriage is not a 50/50 proposition – it is 100/100. It's a give all you have relationship.

That's what Christ did. As Saint Paul tells us He poured Himself out for us, He took the form of a slave, a servant to us, and literally emptied Himself of life on the cross. That's the kind of love sacramental marriage demonstrates - heroic love.

Love that is patient and kind; Love that is never jealous or pompous, that's not inflated or rude. Love that doesn't seek its own interests. Love that isn't quick tempered and doesn't brood over injury (it doesn't hold onto resentments). Love that rejoices in the truth. Love that bears all things, believes all things; hopes all things; endures everything. Love that never fails!

And as the Father, Son and the Spirit are an unbreakable union, so too, marriage is a union that is meant to be unbreakable. If in marriage we live the love described in St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians then love never fails.

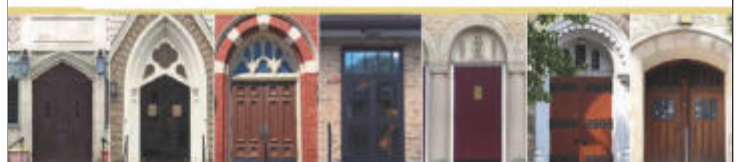
And this is why Jesus speaks so strongly about marriage. Because marriage isn't just a relationship between two people. The unity of two that become one points to the unity of the Trinity and is a visible manifestation of sacrificial love. Marriage is Godly, and if well-lived, it leads us to God himself.
