Honestly, Jesus must have been incredibly patient if not completely frustrated by the Apostles. Either they didn't understand what He was teaching them or they forgot what they were taught all together.

It was just four weeks ago, on the way to Capernaum, that they were arguing over who was going to have the highest position when Jesus came into His Kingdom. The Lord's response could not have been any clearer. If anyone wanted to be first then he had to become the last and be the servant to all. (Mk9:35)

And now, only one chapter later, John (the one whom Jesus loved) and his brother James approach Jesus asking for the highest places in the Kingdom. Apparently they forgot the first lesson from the previous chapter. Perhaps they thought that because they saw themselves as part of Christ's "inner circle," along with Peter, that the previous lesson didn't apply to them. They certainly didn't have a clue yet as to the true nature of the Kingdom.

What became of humility? Is it any wonder the other ten were a little peeved?

Still, being a very patient teacher, Jesus offers a refresher course about what it really means to be great. "Be a servant", He said. No, be more than that – "Be a slave to all."

We are not unlike James and John in this Gospel account. We look for the big promotion, the esteem of our co-workers and neighbors and seek out places of honor. But if we do find ourselves in positions of authority and power, which is not necessarily a bad thing, we need to find ways to use those positions as servants to our communities, places of worship, businesses, co-workers and neighbors.

And we are not unlike the other ten either. We get miffed when someone cuts us in line or when we are passed over in favor of someone else. We become jealous if someone else is honored when we think it should be us. We get angry when we're doing all the right things and someone who isn't gets the advantage.

I suppose all of this is natural. It's kind of in our DNA to want to be special. Still, that's not the attitude Jesus teaches. He isn't asking for what comes natural to us but for what is "super" natural. Jesus is asking us to become more than what our flesh provides for. And to do those things that go against the grain of human self-interest.

Where does this "super" power come from? I can tell you it's not from the planet Krypton. It's not from the bite of a radio-active spider or overexposure to gamma rays.

God Himself is our superpower imparting the grace that gives us the strength to live the lives for which we were ultimately created. It is a life in which God loves us and we love God in return and that mutual love gives birth to a love of neighbor and lives of self-sacrificing service. There are times when all of us fall short of our calling. It happens to everyone. It's like we forget where to find grace and who it is that gives it to us.

Feeling a little grace anemic? Need a booster shot of grace? Here's how you can fill your tank – no cost! Find a regular time to pray and make it a habit. Read scripture daily. You can do it while you're praying and if you don't know where to start the Gospels from daily Mass are a good place to begin. Here is a link. <https://bible.usccb.org/readings/calendar>

Finally, and of great importance, the Lord gave us the sacraments of the Church as a means to impart grace. Frequent reception of the sacraments, especially reconciliation and Eucharist are vital for a life of Grace.

Now that we've found it, let's use this life of grace to become humble servants one to another not seeking out what is best for ourselves but what is best for our neighbor.
