# From Deacon Joe MacDonald

Do Whatever He Tells You.

We have one of those home water coolers. It holds a 5-gallon jug of water. When it's empty I take it to a store that has a spring water dispenser outside, I put my quarters in and get the jug filled. Do you know how much that jug of water weighs? It weighs 42.7 pounds. I don't know how many of you think that's heavy but I sure do. In fact, I loathe carrying it back to the car and into the house. I almost always need help to lift it, turn it upside down and place it in the cooler without spilling it all over the place.

What does this have to do with today's Gospel?

We've heard the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana hundreds of times. So many times, in fact we don't even think twice. Often, the words just flow over us and we miss some of the more interesting details.

Mary told the servants at the wedding "Do whatever he tells you." That's great advice even today.

Jesus noticed that there were 6 water jugs and he told them to fill those with water. Now this is the part I bet we never think about. To have a jug or container large enough to hold 30 gallons of water, each of those jugs had to weigh at least 60 pounds. I think that in itself is pretty heavy and I'm sure awkward to move around. And we don't think about what it would have entailed to fill those jugs. They didn't have faucets with running water. They had to drag those 60+ pound jugs to where the water was and it wasn't in the next room. Then, they had to bring those jugs now filled with water back to Jesus.

I'll do the math for you. A gallon of water is 8.54 pounds times 30 per clay container is 256 pounds, plus 60 for the weight of the clay jug for a grand total of 316 pounds per jar. In all they had to move 1,896 pounds of water from the village well to the place of the wedding. I bet they were muttering to themselves "Why did we listen to this guy?" But they did what they were asked and when they were done, they laid down their burden in front of the Lord.

Usually, we hear this passage and don't think twice about what it involved. We don't think of what it meant for the servants. We rarely think of the burdens that those who serve us bear. Jesus didn't ask those men to do something easy. He asked them to do what was hard. And when they did, Jesus provided wine for the wedding, He just didn't provide wine – he provided great wine. He didn't just give them enough, he gave them an abundance of wine, more than enough. Again, I'll do the math for you – he gave them 180 gallons of wine. That would be about 36 of the 5-

-gallon jugs I use for my cooler.

Today, Mary instructs us in the same way: "Do whatever he tells you." But be prepared, he may tell us to do something hard.

This are some of the things Jesus asks us to do:

"Be not afraid" (sounds easy unless you're in the midst of a pandemic); "Come follow me"; "Love one another"; "Love your enemies (What!);" "Do good to those who hurt you" (That's crazy talk); "Turn the other cheek"; "Forgive"(seriously?); "Eat this bread"; "Drink this cup"; "Do this in memory of me"; "Take up your cross"; "Go and make disciples of all nations"; "Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

I maintain that none of this is easy. But if Jesus is asking us to do things that are hard let's remember that when the Father asked him to do something hard – he did it. "Not my will but your will be done."

When we do all that he tells us, Jesus takes what is ordinary and creates something extraordinary. Water becomes wine, broken bodies are healed, bread becomes his body and wine his blood. Sinners become saints and eternal life crushes the grip of death.

If only we had ears to hear and eyes that see, we might finally understand what marvels we could witness if only we listen and obey our Blessed Mother when she says; "Do whatever he tells you."
