FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Dear Parishioners,

At Baptism, we have all been a witness to the outpouring of the Holy Spirit when those words are said: "I Baptize you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." When those words are spoken, they are not just words, they are the reception of grace—both actual and sanctifying. In the first reading from Isaiah, he is speaking to the people to take comfort that the Lord will come— "to go up onto a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news." As Paul is writing to Titus, he is reminding the people that we have been delivered through the grace of our God by Christ, and that we need nothing else. "When the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we have done, but because of His mercy, He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit." Luke; in the Gospel helps us to remember of how John was telling the people to be ready, to be aware that the one who comes after me is the one that you are looking for. After John Baptizes Christ, we hear the voice of the Father for all to know of whom Christ was; "you are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased." Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we are infused with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and made heirs of hope, of love and of grace that leads us to eternal life.
