

FAMILY NOTES, II Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 16, 2022

Dear friends, Peace in Jesus!

REFLECTION

As Christmas closes out I remain impressed with St. Luke twice telling us that Our Blessed Mother "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (2:19 & 51). In that context and for both of our spiritual reflections I offer you the following pieces. I trust that they may bless you as they have me.

VALUABLE

Quoting St. Augustine, Fr. William R. Bonniwell, O.P. writes, "Nothing can more powerfully arouse my hopes of gaining the glory of heaven (glorious immortality) than the realization of how much God loves me and how valuable I am in his sight." From Magnificat, January, 2022, p.101.

I have ever heard that God loves me but I never heard before that I am "valuable" to Him. I keep reflecting on that and what it means.

Long ago on retreat with many priests Jesus Our Lord told me, "My Father's greatest gift to me is you!" So each of us is so 'valuable' to God that the <u>most 'valuable' gift</u> He could give to His Jesus is each of us! THAT IS WORTH REFLECTING ON! Check Jesus in John 17:24.

NOTHING MORE IMPORTANT

Archbishop Alfred Hughes in his book "Priests in Love with God", p.163, writes this. "The core message of the Gospel: God has created every human being; he sustains each in existence; even after the original fall and personal sin, he offers redemption in Christ Jesus; this Lord and Savior died for our sins and rose for our justification; nothing is more important than eternal salvation and life with him forever. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Good News."

SACRIFICE / LOVE

From the Rite of marriage, 1964: "Sacrifice is often difficult and irksome, love can make it easy and perfect love can make it a joy."

MORE!

From Galatians 2:19-20: "...that I might live for God, I have been crucified with Christ, yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me."

GRIP

Finally, I found an alternate translation of II Corinthians 5:4. Usually one hears "For the love of Christ impel us." Powerful certainly. The other? "The love of Christ holds us in its grip!" Yes! As Jesus Himself said, "My sheep ...shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand" (John 10:27-28).

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Students and Families: I am praying that you are well and taking good care of each other in the New Year. We will continue with remote, home lessons for the remainder of January. Lessons will be sent home each week in an email and posted online to your child's grade level page at holyfamilyrockland.org. We anticipate returning to in person classes the week of Sunday, February 6th.

If you and I were together for class this week in person, we would be looking at our big Liturgical Calendar, like the one pictured to the left, and talking about what comes next, now that the Christmas season has ended. (Remember, the liturgical calendar is the calendar the Catholic Church uses to celebrate Sundays, Saints feast days, and special seasons in the Church.)

Today, we celebrate the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary time is green on the calendar. For many Sundays in this lectionary cycle (Cycle C), our readings will be

taken from the Gospel of Luke. Occasionally, however, we will read from John's Gospel. This is true of today's Gospel reading, which describes the beginning of Jesus' ministry and his first miracle at the Wedding of Cana.

This weekend, we celebrate the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. (1/15/1929). He is one of the most important leaders in U.S. history and one of the iconic figures of the Civil Rights Movement in the United States during the 1950s and 1960s. Dr. King's fight against discrimination and segregation changed American history and gave hope to millions of a future of equality.

Dr. King's call for racial equality is echoed in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. "Created in the image of the one God and equally endowed with rational souls, all men (and women) have the same nature and the same origin. Redeemed by the sacrifice of Christ, all are called to participate in the same divine beatitude: all therefore enjoy an equal dignity." (CCC 1934).

Pope Francis, in his address to Congress in 2015 noted that King's message of equality is rooted in the Gospel passage of the Golden Rule. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Mt 7:12).

As the Holy Father stated: "This Rule points us in a clear direction.

- Let us treat others with the same passion and compassion with which we want to be treated.
- Let us seek for others the same possibilities which we seek for ourselves.
- Let us help others to grow, as we would like to be helped ourselves.
- In a word, if we want security, let us give security; if we want life, let us give life; if we want opportunities, let us provide opportunities.
- The yardstick we use for others will be the yardstick which time will use for us.
- The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of its development."
