






St. Stephen | Feast Day December 26

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his ST STEPHEN wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and


sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin. Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death. Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

# Pastor's Column

As I write this on Monday, December 13, I certainly hope the **Christmas liturgies** were faith filled, inspiring and joyous celebrations. This year should have looked more normal in attendance than last year with so many COVID restrictions once in place now lifted. Please still be cautious. Wear a mask if you wish and if you are not feeling well please pray at home by watching our live stream or EWTN on TV. It is certainly not the same as in person Mass attendance but each of us needs to keep ourselves and others safe. Fr. Miller and I continue to visit COVID patients in the Hanover Hospital so we are not beyond this pandemic.

Thanks to the entire Latino community that made the 12:00 celebration for **Our Lady of Guadalupe** a most joyful occasion on Sunday, December 12. Since this feast fell on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent this year, the Sunday Solemnity had prominence liturgically over the celebration of Our Lady but she was still very present visually in the art work and in the hearts and minds of the people in attendance, Latino and Anglo alike. Thanks to Auggie and his cooks and servers for the never ending food for the dinner following the Mass. Not all the priests could attend the dinner since we had to help with confessions at the Parish Penance Service at Annunciation BVM in McSherrystown at 2:00 that afternoon.

I want to extend an invitation to parishioners to join our RCIA classes on Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m. This year we have a very small class and so it can double as an **adult Catholic education** class. If you would like to brush up on the basics of the Catholic faith feel free to join us as we resume the classes on Thursday, January 6. The classes normally conclude around 8:30 or 9:00 p.m. We meet in the multi-purpose room in the school building. Enter through the door into the narthex and go down the hall way.

We received a thank you letter from Edna Ogwangi of the *Rise Against Hunger* organization, for our parish contribution of \$100.00. This is a worldwide organization "dedicated to reaching those facing hunger." They serve 1.7 million beneficiaries in the world including 400,000 school children. They dream big, like trying to end world hunger by 2030. But, they do it "one child, one community, one day at a time, multiplied by hundreds of partners both in the U.S. and in countries around the world.

One person and one effort at a time is important. On our property is a recycling bin for aluminum cans. It is over by the boccie courts. About once every 5 weeks **Rick Winand** picks up and sorts the cans to be recycled. He gets 60 cents per pound for them which comes back to the parish. Thanks Rick for your humble quiet service.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of **The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph**. May God's Blessings be with your family in the New Year!




# Points to Prayerfully Ponder
