

Pastor's Column

Today we celebrate the **Epiphany of the Lord**. An epiphany can be defined as "an appearance or manifestation of a deity; a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of something, usually initiated by some simple, homely, or commonplace occurrence or experience" (Dictionary.com). Both definitions apply to this Sunday. The Christ child has appeared and God has revealed to Mary by an angel and to Joseph in a dream the mystery of His plan for salvation. Yes, Jesus came to the Jewish people as the Messiah, the Christ. The magi from the east reflect that limited understanding when upon arrival in Jerusalem they ask "Where is the newborn King of the Jews?" These seekers who studied the stars could not have realized the larger meaning of their discovery.

The meaning of their discovery of Jesus, as stated in the Responsorial Psalm, clearly expands that limited understanding when it proclaims "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." Jesus is more than the Messiah to the Jewish people. St. Paul is explicit in the second reading about Jesus also coming for the Gentiles, that is the rest of the world when he says, "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel." Jesus is the Savior of the World. This is the Epiphany of the Lord.

Welcome to 2021. May it be a year of restored health to a weary world still sick with COVID and sick of still having to deal with it by vaccinations, masks and restrictions even for our own safety. So many have died. Families have been torn apart with some members vaccinated and others not, resulting in family quarrels and turning away from each other distancing themselves from what were once hugs. Christmas gatherings for dinner were not what they once were for many families. We have lots of reason to pray.

Courage! Whatever this New Year brings we meet it together in the Lord Jesus. As we begin this year together I offer to you this prayer of St. Teresa.

Let nothing disturb you;
Nothing frighten you.
All things are passing.
God never changes.
Patience obtains all things.
Nothing is wanting
to him who possess God.
God alone suffices.

Yesterday, we celebrated the **Solemnity of Mary, The Holy Mother of God.** Mary is the Mother of God because she is the mother of the second person of the Holy Trinity. It would be a mistake, one which the early Church had to address, for us to think Mary is the mother of only the human part of Jesus-his human nature. However, Mary did not give birth to a nature. She gave birth to a person, a divine person with a human and divine nature. One person with two natures. Mary, as the mother of this divine person in Jesus is thus "The Mother of God." This title was canonized in 431 by the Council of Ephesus.
