Pastor's Column

Let me begin with a big **THANK YOU** for your many Christmas gifts to the clergy and staff of our parish. We are continuing to enjoy them, be they monetary gifts, gift cards, food or prayers for us. All are welcome, especially your prayers. They sustain us in our ministries and efforts to serve you. Some of the gifts came without a name attached or the card with the gift became unattached, and so we are not sure what card was with what gift. In any event, thank you for thinking of us and we are grateful for your kindness and generosity.

If you are reading this on Saturday or Sunday, January 8 or 9, Merry Christmas. **It is still Christmas**. We are in the Christmas Season, but only for one more day, today, Sunday, The Baptism of the Lord. Tomorrow begins Ordinary Time in the Church and continues through Tuesday, March 1, the day before Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the Lenten Season. So we have a little more than 7 weeks before Lent begins. It seems quick I know.

Since we are still in the Christmas Season let me provide you with "**The Story Behind the Carol**," that is one of the most favorite carols for Christmas, Silent Night. Josef Mohr was the pastor of the Church of St. Nicholas at Oberndorf, near Salzburg, Austria. Walking home one night Mohr chose the longer way that took him up over a hill overlooking the village. Reveling in the silence of the wintry night, he remembered a poem he had written. He decided those words might make a good carol for his congregation. He went to see the church organist, Franz Gruber, and asked him to come up with a melody.

On Christmas Eve, 1818, the little Oberndorf congregation heard Gruber and Mohr play their new carol. It spread across northern Europe, and in 1834 singers performed Silent Night for King Frederick William IV of Prussia, who then ordered his cathedral choir to sing it every Christmas Eve. Twenty years after Silent Night was written, the song was brought to the United States, in New York City's Trinity Church. Silent Night is now sung in more than 300 different languages around the world.

A parishioner wrote to me saying, "I am currently completing the **Bible in a Year** podcasts by Father Mike Schmitz, and it is a very good podcast. It is well done and takes about 30 minutes per day and I have learned a lot about the Bible and the foundations of our faith. You can start the English version anytime. I started in the fall and have finished it on day 53." The Spanish version begins in 2022. Fr. Rothan will be publicizing this in the Latino Bulletin. This seems like a great way to learn about our Catholic faith and the Bible. Why not take a look into it?




Grandview Seniors


