

# Pastor's Column

I heard from Father William R. Thompson, Pastor of Saint Joseph Church in **Central City, Kentucky**. If you recall we recently made an effort to help them in **tornado relief**. Father Thompson wrote the following in his first three paragraphs of his letter to me. "Many Blessings to you and your parish this Christmas Season. Over the last week, St. Joseph in Central City received generous support from your parish community. It is with humble gratitude that I write today on behalf of our community acknowledging the good that you all have accomplished. To date, we have received \$9,245.00 in donations for tornado relief in our small community."

"There are many kind notes of encouragement from your parishioners that bring hope and joy. The generous gifts will go to the local Muhlenberg Disaster Relief fund and to the individual families needing assistance as they rebuild."

"Currently, we are moving through the various stages of crisis. The parish is filled with supplies for people in need. I am reminded of the prophet Elijah and his encounter with God on the mountain. It was not in the storms that God's voice was heard, but in the silent whisper. Likewise, in our local community it is in the silent moments that God continues to reveal Himself to His people. The generous support of your parishioners is one such avenue that God reveals his abundant goodness. On behalf of our parish and the local community, I extend our gratitude and prayers for you all." (Thanks to Shara Heacock who was raised in the area of Central City, Kentucky, and who brought their need for help to my attention. Thank you, the people of St. Joseph Parish here in Hanover, for your generosity to our brothers and sisters in St. Joseph Parish in Kentucky.)


