





Pastor's Column

Each weekday this week the church asks us to remember a particular saint. On Monday is **St. Francis de Sales** (1567-1622). The life of this outstanding and highly influential bishop, spiritual director, author, preacher and Doctor of the Church spans the turbulent decades following the protestant Reformation. He had a doctorate in both civil and canon law and was ordained a priest in 1593 and immediately dedicated himself to the re-evangelization of Chablais, which had become almost entirely Calvinistic. He won many converts to the Church. At the age of 32 he was ordained an auxiliary bishop and later became the Bishop of Geneva. Francis was the co-founder, with St. Jane Frances de Chantal, of the Visitation nuns.

The Conversion of St. Paul is celebrated as a Feast Day on Tuesday. The importance of the conversion of the "Apostle to the Gentiles" is evident from the three accounts given in the Acts of the Apostles (9: 1-30; 22: 3-21; 26: 9-20). The biblical account of what happened to Paul on the road to Damascus describes the radical change that took place: "He who was formerly persecuting us is now preaching the faith he tried to destroy: (Gal 1: 11-24). As Saul, a zealous Pharisee, he persecuted the Church and so played before and after his conversion an important role in the history and development of the early Church.

St. Timothy and St. Titus is an obligatory memorial on Wednesday. These two were companions of St. Paul. Timothy was born of a Greek father and a Jewish mother. He was converted to Christianity by St. Paul on his first missionary journey and accompanied Paul on his second and third journeys. He was the head of the Church at Ephesus. Titus came from a pagan family and he also converted to Christianity during Paul's fist missionary journey. He accompanied Paul and Barnabas to the Council at Jerusalem. Paul assigned Titus as head of the Church in Crete.

St. Angela Merici (1474-1540) was born in Brescia in northern Italy and left orphan at the age of fifteen. She gave up the family inheritance and joined the Franciscan Tertiaries in order to live in poverty. She attracted a group of devout laity, members of the nobility and persons of humble station in life, and in 1535 she founded a religious institute under the patronage of St. Ursula (Ursulines). She wanted them to be consecrated to God and dedicated to the service of their neighbor, but remaining in the world and living a celibate life in their own homes. She thus anticipated the secular institutes that flourished in modern times.

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) is an obligatory memorial on Friday. He was born at the castle of Roccasecca, near Montecassino, Italy, the son of the Count of Aquino and a mother of German descent. As a child he was educated by the Benedictines and studied at the University of Naples, where he encountered the Dominicans and joined their ranks at the age of 18. Thomas had a thirst for knowledge and truth and so continued his studies in Paris and then in Cologne, where he studied under St. Albert the Great. For ten years, 1259-1269 he was at the service of Pope Urban IV. From 1269-1272, again in Paris, he wrote his commentaries on various works of Aristotle and the greater part of his famous <u>Summa Theologiae.</u>




