

Pastor's Column

Thanks to the parishioner family who made a donation that covered the cost of the Matthew Kelly book, **Life is Messy**. 350 were ordered in English and 125 in Spanish. Happy reading!

As of February 28, we donated **\$4,140.90** to the Poor Missions/Black and Indian collection. Thank you for your concern for the poor.

On Saturday, March 19, we celebrate the solemnity of **St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. "The figure of this great saint, even though remaining somewhat hidden, is of fundamental importance in the history of salvation. His greatness, like Mary's, stands out even more because his mission was carried out in the humility and hiddenness of the house of Nazareth. Moreover, God himself, in the person of his Incarnate Son, chose this way and style of life—humility and hiddenness—in his earthly existence. From the example of Saint Joseph we all receive a strong invitation to carry out with fidelity, simplicity, and modesty the task that providence has entrusted to us. I think especially of fathers and mothers of families, and I pray that they will always be able to appreciate the beauty of a simple and industrious life, cultivating the conjugal relationship with care and fulfilling with enthusiasm the great and difficult educational mission." (Holiness is always in Season, Pope Benedict XVI).

"We seem to live in a time of push and shove, rather than 'Please you first.' Or 'Go ahead; I'm in no hurry.' Can the celebration of St. Joseph perhaps move us to consider such counter cultural practices as gentleness, humility, patience, forbearance, even being soft-spoken and willing to accede to others' needs" (Homilies for Weekdays, Don Talafous)?

"There are around 1800 images and scenes carved into the stones of Chartres [Cathedral]" 'and most of them are in spots where they can never be seen.' "But for many of the sculptors of Chartres, God was the only audience they thought they would ever have, and he was the only one they needed. It really did not matter to these men whether any mere mortals saw, appreciated or understood what they had done." 'Similarly, for men and women of conscience like Joseph, all that matters is God's judgement. Joseph stands out for not standing out.' (In Universe of Stone, Phillip Ball, quoted in Talafous).

Congratulations to the 58 students from our St. Joseph School and our parish School of Religious Education on receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this past Saturday. Thanks to the parents, teachers, and catechists who have prepared these students for the sacraments.


